NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION

The gatehouse/entrance is centered on a short access road that leads the visitor north off State Road 46 into McCormick's Creek State Park. The entrance is approximately three miles east of Spencer in Owen County and well above the flood plain of the West Fork of the White River that forms the western boundary of the park. The gatehouse is bracketed by a stoneand-timber fence in two sections that on each side of the access road curves southward toward the highway. (These sections count as two additional resources, along with the gatehouse itself.) The fence consists of rough limestone masonry piers, about 28 inches high, separated by eightfoot sections comprised of two logs about four inches in diameter. The section of fence west of the access road has 22 piers; the section on the east has thirty. At each end of the fence nearest the gatehouse is a larger stone masonry structure giving the effect of a gate; these stand about six feet high and are topped with four-sided carriage lights (see photos 1, 2). Between the two sections of fence and the access road are wide grassy spaces, but the gatehouse itself seems virtually buried in forest. Large hardwood trees surround the gatehouse except on the south, and the entrance road through a substantial woods narrows considerably immediately north of the building.

Visitors enter the park to the right (east) of the building and exit to the west of it. A small grassy space set off by short timber posts lies on the south of the gatehouse between the entrance and exit lanes.

The gatehouse is a completely symmetrical one-story T-gabled building of random limestone masonry and roofed with wood shingles. On the east and west elevations (see photos 3, 4) are identical open entrance porches supported by four hewn posts beneath the extended gable ends, in which hewn beams comprise the bracing. The tripartate entrances in each case consist of a wooden frame door with a ten-light fixed sash, and two ten-pane sidelights. The large window on the south facade (see photo 3) is of three parts as well, two ten-light sashes bracketing a fifteen-light fixed sash. The north elevation is dominated by a large limestone fireplace chimney on the gable end with a small sash window, each with a hewn timber lintel, on either side.

The interior of the gatehouse remains largely as it was constructed, with a stone floor, uncovered stone walls, and open rafters and bracing of hewn timbers above. A large stone fireplace, no longer used, is built into the north wall (see photo 5). The only alteration in the space has been the partitioning off in the northwest corner enough space for a small restroom.

NARRATIVE STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Nestled beneath its forest canopy just off SR46, the gatehouse/entrance at McCormick's Creek State Park is among the best examples of a park rustic gatehouse built by the Civilian Conservation Corps in any Indiana state park. As such, it offers a splendid material record of an important area of New Deal public works and recreational development in Indiana state parks during the 1930s, as described in the historic context "New Deal Work Programs in Indiana State Parks." As noted in the associated property type identified as "Properties associated with New Deal work projects related to infrastructure development," the gatehouse/entrance, a resource related to public access, is eligible under Criterion A (in the areas of recreation and in social history) because it is associated with the New Deal's work programs and park development in the 1930s. The building is also eliqible under Criterion C because it is representative of the work and the style of architecture typical of the CCC. The gatehouse/entrance meets all the standards of integrity established in the multiple property nomination "New Deal Resources in Indiana State Parks." The building stands in its original location in its original setting. But for minor interior alterations noted in the description (i.e., the addition of a small restroom) the design and materials remain intact, and the building is representative of and associated with typical CCC workmanship—timber construction and stone masonry.

McCormick's Creek State Park was the first of Indiana's state parks, established in 1916 even before the Indiana Department of Conservation was created. Within a few years, an existing building was remodeled into a park inn, some picnic areas established, and a few trails built. The park was very popular, and the Department of Conservation saw to the construction of a swimming pool and bath house near the inn in the late 1920s. McCormick's Creek also boasted group camping facilities. With the establishment of CCC Company 589 at Camp SP-4 from November 1933 until July 1935, McCormick's Creek undertook an ambitious and much-needed new development program. Besides extensive landscaping and additional road and trail building, the CCC boys worked on the construction of numerous outdoor recreational facilities and their supporting infrastructure, into which category falls the entrance and gatehouse. It was completed in 1935 shortly before the camp closed and Company 589 relocated to a new camp near Lagro.

The building is an especially fine example of local adaptation of the park rustic style favored by the National Park Service. Such a style, interpreted with native materials, harmonized visually with the park environment, a goal stated both by NPB and the state Department of Conservation. The CCC workers used local timber and limestone to construct a charming cottage—like gatehouse that to this day seems to suggest some of the delights of nature to be found within the park.



VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION

Bounded on the south by the north edge of State Road 46; on the east by a line extending due north from a point on the highway just south of the eastern portion of the stone—and—timber fence to a line running east—west that is ten feet north of the north wall of the gatehouse, said line being the northern boundary, and south from this east—west line to the highway, along a line that is just west of the westernmost extension of the western portion of the stone—and timber fence. See also — enclosed scale map with boundary.

BOUNDARY JUSTIFICATION

Such boundaries encompass the gatehouse and its accompanying fence.
