PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION

The Marks House is a two-story wood frame structure with an irregular floor plan. Horizontal sheathing and shingles are used on the exterior vertical surfaces. Asphalt shingles have replaced the original wood shingles on the roof. The roof form is principally a truncated hip with an off center gable. A round turret is located on the northwest corner of the house. It is framed by a one-story veranda which curves around the front to the side.

Jake Marks was a wealthy cattle rancher, wholesale liquor dealer, and mine owner. His home, designed by architect W.R. Norton of Phoenix, is one of four prominent residences built on "Nob Hill" during the 1890s. The structure is exemplary of upper class housing in Prescott from that period.
