**Reason for Removal:** The property has ceased to meet the criteria for listing because the qualities which caused it to be listed have been lost or destroyed (36 CFR 60.15 (a)).

Dates and Nature of Change: Razed, 22 October 2007

#### Comments:

The 1891 Adrian State Bank was one of three buildings, including the Slade Hotel (NR 75000999) and the Becker Block, that were located at the intersection of Maine Avenue and Second Street in Adrian. When the bank was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1980, the nomination noted that the three buildings together represented the early commerce of this southwest Minnesota city. Of the three, only the Slade Hotel remains.<sup>1</sup>

Built in the Queen Anne Commercial style, the Adrian State Bank building retained its original tenant until 1969 when the bank moved two blocks away. For another 10 years, The Print Shop of Adrian operated there, moving out in 1979.<sup>2</sup> A year later, when it was nominated to the National Register, the building was vacant.<sup>1</sup> It changed hands a number of times after 1979 but remained vacant and its condition deteriorated. After a fire in the early 1990s and later a storm with straight-line winds that caused part of an exterior wall to collapse, the property was determined to be a safety hazard and the City of Adrian acquired it through eminent domain and demolished it in 2007.<sup>2</sup> A single-story liquor store called The Den, established in 2015, now occupies the lot.<sup>3</sup>

In considering the seven aspects of integrity (location, setting, design, workmanship, materials, feeling, and association), it is worth noting that at the time of its nomination, the physical structure of the Adrian State Bank was already compromised but was considered to have retained "some integrity." The integrity of location, design, workmanship, and materials were all lost when the building was demolished. While still part of downtown Adrian, the integrity of the setting is severely compromised with the loss of both the Becker Block, now the site of a parking lot, and the Adrian State Bank. The feeling and association were also lost when the property was torn down.

The old Adrian State Bank is a rectangular commercial block built of soft red brick. It was constructed as a single block but with three conceptual units. The front portion is a corner unit with a square tower. The original front entrance has been filled-in and is now a window. Access is through an adjoining building. On the side facade a central unit has a door flanked by symmetrical window treatments. To the rear is a three-story unit (the rest of the bank is two-story) that forms a somewhat separate commercial unit. It has smaller windows but with the same treatment as in the rest of the building.

First floor windows are rectangular. Second floor windows are round-arched. In the tower all windows are arched. Brick hood moldings accentuate the windows. Pressed metal brackets support a boxed cornice. Metal is also used in the pyramidal tower roof and in several false-fronted pediments. There is a brick frieze below the cornice. The main entrance reads "Bank" and "1891." One pediment reads "Mylius."

#### SIGNIFICANCE:

1891 saw a boom in commercial block construction in Adrian. At one intersection three substantial buildings were erected: the Slade Hotel (previously listed on the National Register), the Becker Block, and the Adrian State Bank. The facade entrance of the Becker Block has been poorly modernized, but the bank retains some integrity. Its relationship to the Slade Hotel makes it an important structure to preserve.

Mylius Brothers were important financial agents in southwestern Minnesota. They served as land agents for the Close Brothers Land Company and established banks in several other communities. The Adrian Bank is the only remaining structure that they built, though a hotel in Pipestone once housed one of their operations.

The interior of the bank lobby is largely intact, including marble and wood counters

and a porcelain water fountain.
