According to an 1894 biography, Gaar's old house burned shortly after the death of his wife in 1862. The 1870 division plat shows a house in the location of the present house. Gaar's daughter Pamela Smith inherited the house but sold it immediately to her sister Priscilla Fenton. Priscilla and David Fenton lived there for the twenty-seven years. The Fenton heirs sold the property to the Frederick Doll family 1897 and they owned it until 1920.
