ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION AND PRESENT CONDITION: Victorian; two stories tall with one story pentagonal room to west and two story bay window on south end of front facade, rectangular plan, hip and gable roof, three interior chimneys, one story front porch runs length of facade, small second story porch to west of bay window; weatherboard frame construction with brick foundation, metal shingle roof; front facade details include turned porch posts and balustrade, wagon wheel gingerbread trim, eaves have vertically laid 3" wide boards and brackets with corner gable brackets over bay window; interior plan has a side hall with three rooms up and three down, one story kitchen and shed addition to rear; situated in (cont

Members of the Fletcher Family resided at this address until 1902. This house does not appear on the 1889 Sanborn Insurance Map, although it does appear on the 1895 map.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (ARCHITECTURAL AND HISTORICAL): Local History: This house is significant as it was the home of John T. Fletcher, who was associated with "J.M. Fletcher and Son," a local "firm" with interests in livery, boarding and sale of stables. "Fletcher and Son" also incorporated undertakers and embalmers. Architecture: This house is significant because it has the only wagon wheel detail work in Columbus. It is unique for its pentagonal room, eaves detailing and second story porch which repeats the first floor detailing.
