Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

7. Description

The Oronoco School building is located on the south bank of the Mid Fork of the Zumbro River, across from the commercial area of Oronoco, and just east of Bridge No. 448. It is an Italianate two-story symmetrical orange brick structure on a stone foundation which is exposed to the rear. A central hip-roofed rectangle containing the large classrooms is situated on an east-west axis, with gable-roofed bays extending to the north and south. Wide bracketed eves, returned at the gables, extend around the building. Fenestration consists of symmetrically placed four-over-four double-hung sash in very tall, narrow openings with segmental arch brick hoods. The south (front) bay has paired sash in a single round arch opening, centered above double wood doors with arched glass transom. With the exception of the removal of a bell tower in the 1920s, the exterior facades have retained complete design integrity. The interior remains structurally intact.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Oronoco School building is significant as a fine example of rural community institutional Italianate architecture in an excellent state of preservation. It also is significant as a representative of rural community education for the half-century from its construction in 1875 until the construction of a new consolidated Oronoco school in 1926. Settled in the 1850s, Oronoco had shown great promise of growth by the 1870s with the establishment of an important flour mill. Both railroads in the county bypassed Oronoco, however, and by 1900 the community's prosperity had declined considerably. The school, which was described in 1910 as "the most prominent feature of the village," survives as a representative of Oronoco's boom years. The present owner uses the building as a residence and plans to use the large, high-ceilinged rooms as a music hall.
