SIGNIFICANCE:		
This expansive residence with its principal facade perpendicular to Warren Place was designed by W. Leslie Walker for George L. Prentiss. Walker was a resident of Montclair (see 190 Gates Avenue). House was purchased by A. Hall Berry in 1916 and in 1917, the same archi- tect designed the extensive additions, comprising a ballroom in the north wing and servants' quarters in the south wing.		
W. Leslie Walker was a versatile architect who lived in Montclair. He designed the Unitarian Church, the Montclair Women's Club and numerous residences.		
With its clustered chimney pots and leaded windows, this commodious manor house is distinctly English in character. An unusual inter- pretation of the Gothic mode, sited at right angles to the street, the building is unique in a neighborhood where Colonial Revival, Tudor, and Cotswold Cottage type houses predominate.
