Describe present and historic physical appearance.

The Wylam Fire Station was built c. 1910 of dark red brick in a utilitarian commercial style. The building is two stories in height, rectangular shaped with a flat roof and a concrete foundation. The building is located close to the street and is situated on a corner lot.

The main facade features the original massive wood garage doors with decorative steel and wood trim, metal hinges and springs. Above the fire door is a band of three six-over-six double hung wood sash windows. There is a corbelled brick cornice with a decorative stone cap. There is also a large decorative stone panel located above the second story windows and a small stone inset below the windows. The east side of the main facade is slightly recessed back one bay and has one small 4-over-4 double hung sash window on each floor.

The east and west side facades are almost identical and both retain the two original brick chimneys. The east side facade has six steel windows on the first floor; all but one remain intact. All six original wood framed windows remain on the second floor. Original brick sills remain intact as do the two original metal vents. The west facade is identical and intact except that instead of one first floor window there is an original doorway and awning supported by chains.

INTERIOR:

The first floor has wood ceiling beams, wood ceiling, brick walls, and a concrete flooring. The second floor residential area has wood floors, plaster walls and ceiling, and wood window trim. The original pole opening and protective bars are intact, though the pole has been removed. There is also a fire place with bracketed wood mantels. The bath and kitchen areas also remain with some modernizations completed in the 1940s.

INTEGRITY:

The Wylam Fire Station has maintained its integrity as an early 20th-century utilitarian fire station. Neither the exterior or interior has experienced any significant alterations. It is one of the most intact of all remaining fire stations in Birmingham, although it no longer functions as a fire station.

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and periods of significance noted above.

CRITERION A: COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND PLANNING

The Wylam Fire Station is locally significant as a reminder of Wylam's community growth and development. Built in c. 1908-1910, the Wylam Fire Department is one of the best extant buildings in Wylam to illustrate its brief period of growth and independence from the City of Birmingham. Wylam was incorporated in 1900 and was annexed into the City of Birmingham c.1910. The community was built as an industrial town during the first phase of Birmingham's initial industrial boom period. The town of Wylam was built as a utilitarian village with little attention to esthetics or environment. Built during the area's first industrial boom period, it was eclipsed during the 1920s and 1930s by the ICT mining village of Docena, Edgewater, and Bayview. The Wylam Fire Station is the second oldest fire station in Birmingham and the oldest in the Western Industrial suburbs of Birmingham.

CRITERION C: ARCHITECTURE

The Wylam Fire Station is architecturally significant locally as the best preserved example of the early 1900s urban utilitarian fire station type located in Birmingham. Built before 1919, the Wylam Fire Station is a good example of the plain brick utilitarian style and single use functional fire house type which was indicative of the pre-1920s area in Birmingham. After the 1920s the fire stations in Birmingham became more residential in form, style and setting, and often served dual functions.
