DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Eastbrook Baptist Church is a simple classic Greek Revival wood frame clapboarded structure with a tower, built in 1860. The facade features a triangular pediment with a simple entablature and is framed by simple pilasters. Two wooden doors appear on either side of the facade, each with four horizontal panels topped with a transom and Greek cornice. The north and south sides feature two twelve-over-twelve windows with cornices similar to the doors. The setback tower is an unornamented flat roofed square structure with one small window on each side.

The one and a half story wood frame clapboarded Eastbrook Town House was built in 1880-1 in the same basic style as the church. The three bay facade is framed with simple pilasters. The half story has a full size six-over-six window with a simple cornice. The main story features a central doorway with double doors glazed in the upper half beneath a transom and cornice supported by pilasters. The doorway is flanked by two six-over-six windows, each with cornices. The north and south sides feature two double windows each, all with similar cornices. The rear wall is blank.

An entablature runs along either side and up into the gable and the cornice returns over the front corner pilasters.

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8 SIGNIFICANCE



STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Eastbrook Baptist Church and the Eastbrook Town House stand close to one another separated only by about fifty feet of wood lot. Architecturally they are of great interest as they demonstrate the persistance of a particular style in a remote region long after its popularity has waned elsewhere.

The church, built in 1860, is, with the exception of the later added tower, an exceptionally simple and pure example of the Greek Revival. This date is, of course, at the very end of the period in which this style is normally found in Maine.

When the Town Mouse was erected in 1880-81, however, it is clear that the intent was to erect a structure in stylistic accord with its neighbor. Thus there exists a number of strongly imitative details such as window and door cornices and corner pilasters with simple capitals supporting an entablature which, in the case of the Town House, does not extend across the gable end of the front facade.

The result is a Greek Revival building built at least twenty years after the close of the period in which this style flourished. The flown House is presently being used as the town library.
