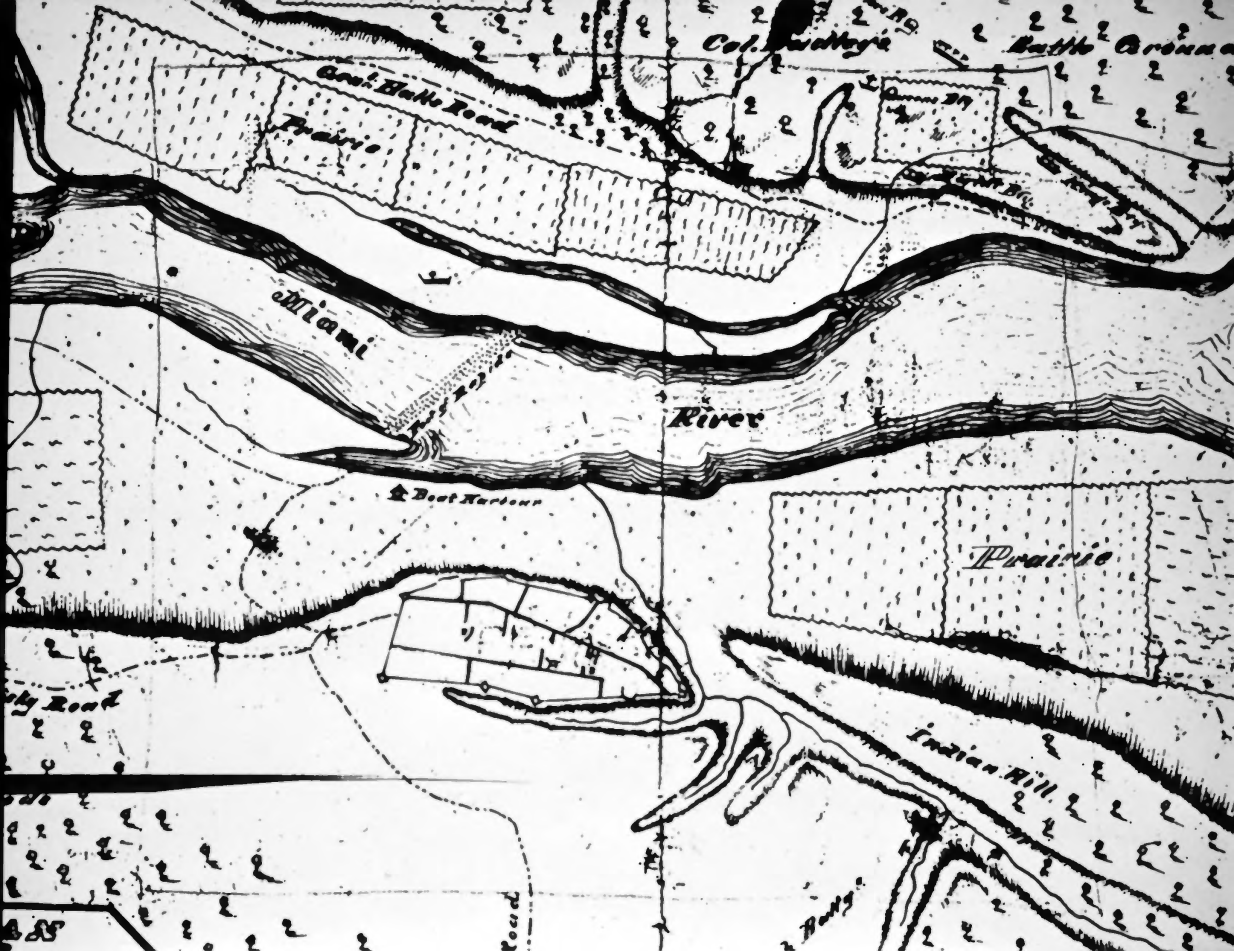

the largest in the West.

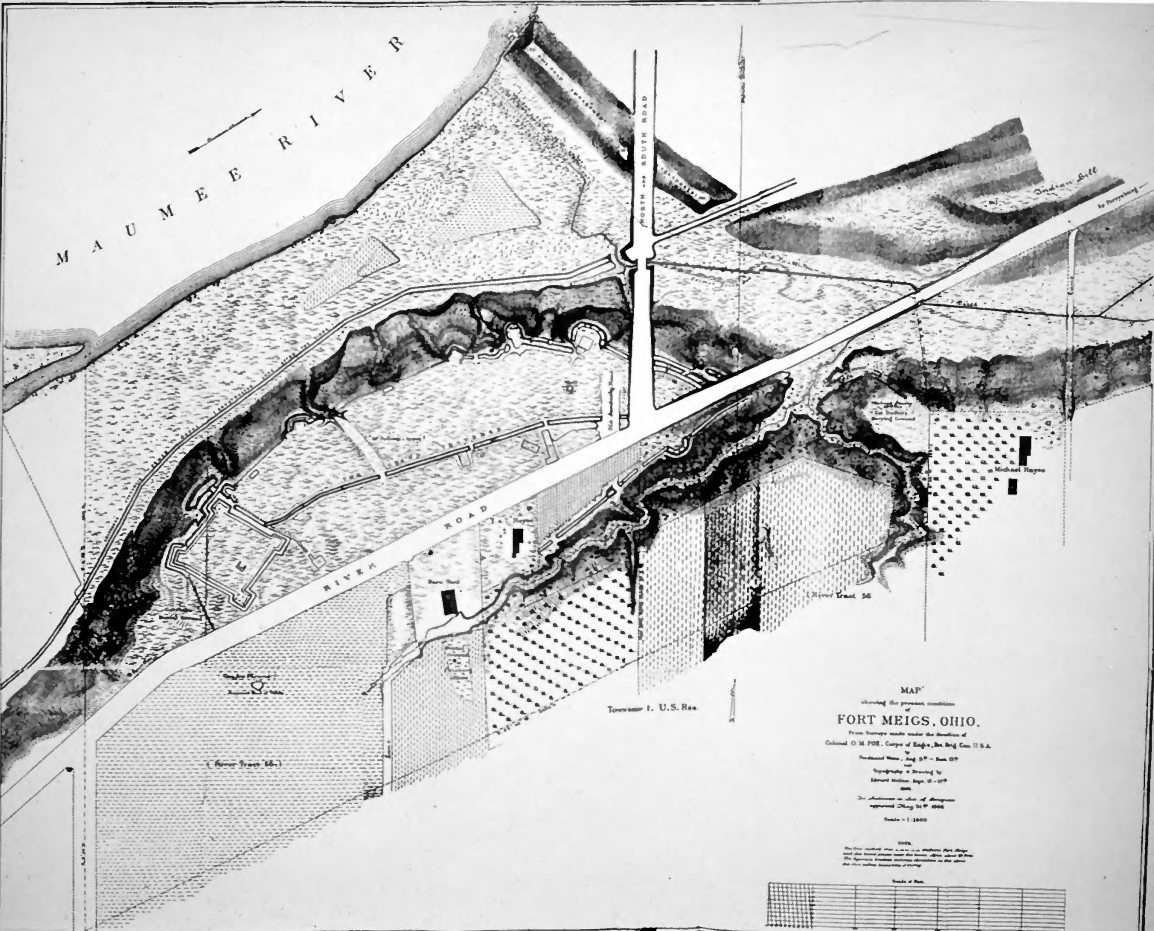
THE TOWN
