During the Railroad Era (1870-1914) in White County a variety of vernacular houses were constructed. They were also built out of a variety of materials. Surviving examples from this period, however, are somewhat limited. The Roy Harper House is a good example of a one-story T-shaped building. It is box constructed while its walls are clad with novelty siding. The gable roof of the building is covered with corrugated metal and the entire structure rests on stone piers.

Located on the north side of County Road 16 one half-mile west of its intersection with County Road 24, this building was constructed approximately three and one-half miles south of the crossroads community of Romance. The Roy Harper House was constructed c. 1912, is presently unoccupied and in fair condition. Its main, or north, elevation of the structure is dominated by a porch that wraps around to the west elevation of the structure. The porch roof is supported by turned posts that are adorned with decorative wooden brackets. Two single wooden doors enter the porch from both the western and northern sides of the building. Fenestration on the main elevation consists of either single or paired symmetrically placed four-over-four double-hung wood sash windows. The gable end on this elevation is decorated with imbricated shingles.

A corbelled brick chimney rises from the gable apex on the western portion of the T. The eastern elevation of the original building is fenestrated with both single and paired symmetrically placed four-over-four double-hung wood sash windows. A shed roof addition is attached to the southwest portion of the original building. It is fenestrated with six-over-six double-hung wood sash windows on both its south and west elevation. Another addition is located on the south elevation of the original building. It has a gable roof and its walls are clad with board and batten. A porch is attached to the west side of this addition and it is connected to the previously mention rear addition. The shed roof of this porch is supported by plain wooden posts and it is entered by two single wooden doors on the west elevation of the board and batten addition. Only one window is found on this portion of the structure and it is asymmetrically placed on the east elevation of the addition.


