


Physical Description

The McRae House in Prescott was designed by the Thompson and Harding firm in 1919. Of wood frame construction, it is faced with wide weatherboards, and is situated on a large corner lot which slopes slightly toward the street. The steep gable end roof, the somewhat narrow facade and the two interior brick side chimneys combine to create a dominant vertical emphasis. A shed roof covers a small entrance porch supported by two plain columns and extends across the facade to the point where it joins the projecting one-story screened porch which has a long segmental arch shaped opening facing the street. French doors lead from the house onto this porch. The front door has a long multi-panes window. Other windows are sash type with eight-over-one or six-over-one lights. Large brackets at the porch eaves and exposed purlins add a Craftsman touch to the simple house.

Statement of Significance

The Thompson and Harding firm in 1919 designed a residence for T. C. McRae in Prescott, Arkansas. The McRae family commissioned the firm to do many buildings in the cities of Prescott and Hope, many of which were commercial structures. Of the remaining buildings representing the prominence of the McRae family in southwestern Arkansas, the T. C. McRae House in Prescott is one of the more unusual residences. Vertical in emphasis, this home derives its picturesqueness from its distinctive asymmetry. The T. C. McRae House features a small entrance porch supported by two plain columns. It extends across the facade to join a large one-story screened-in porch which projects from the east end of the facade. Only a block away from the D. L. McRae House (NE-074), this house is enhanced by a lushly landscaped setting. A long sidewalk shaded by large trees leading from the street to the T. C. McRae House gives a friendly southern feeling to the two-story frame residence.
