

This house, while having been altered through the years, still retains a sufficient amount of its original fabric that it should be recognized and retained. We are therefore including it for its architectural significance, for its association with the exploration and settlement of the Bergen County area, and for its remaining historic fabric. As such, it is included in the Thematic Nomination to the National Register of Historic Places for the Early Stone Houses of Bergen County, New Jersey.





According to Arthur Reeve, Samuel P. Demarest (1729-1808), who lived on the east side of the road and operated a grist mill, had his buildings burned during the Revolution and was captured but returned. His sons Peter and Roelef established farms nearby and may have built this house. Both Peter and Roelef are said to have lived here. Roelef (1756-1814) and his wife Maria had two sons and a daughter. Samuel R. Demarest built the Supino house and John R. Demarest (1785-1851) remained here and married Margaret Cole. John also built and operated a woolen mill, the largest industry in the area, to the east of County Road.
