



## MADISON

County and incorporated in 1806. It is named for William Madison Peyton, a leader in movement for the formation of Boone County in 1847. Peyton, pioneer in the fertile west of the Coal River Valley, looked to the Coal River in the 1840's and the first navigable for steamboats to transport coal from area to markets, and for a period made the Coal Valley one of the great industrial regions of the State.

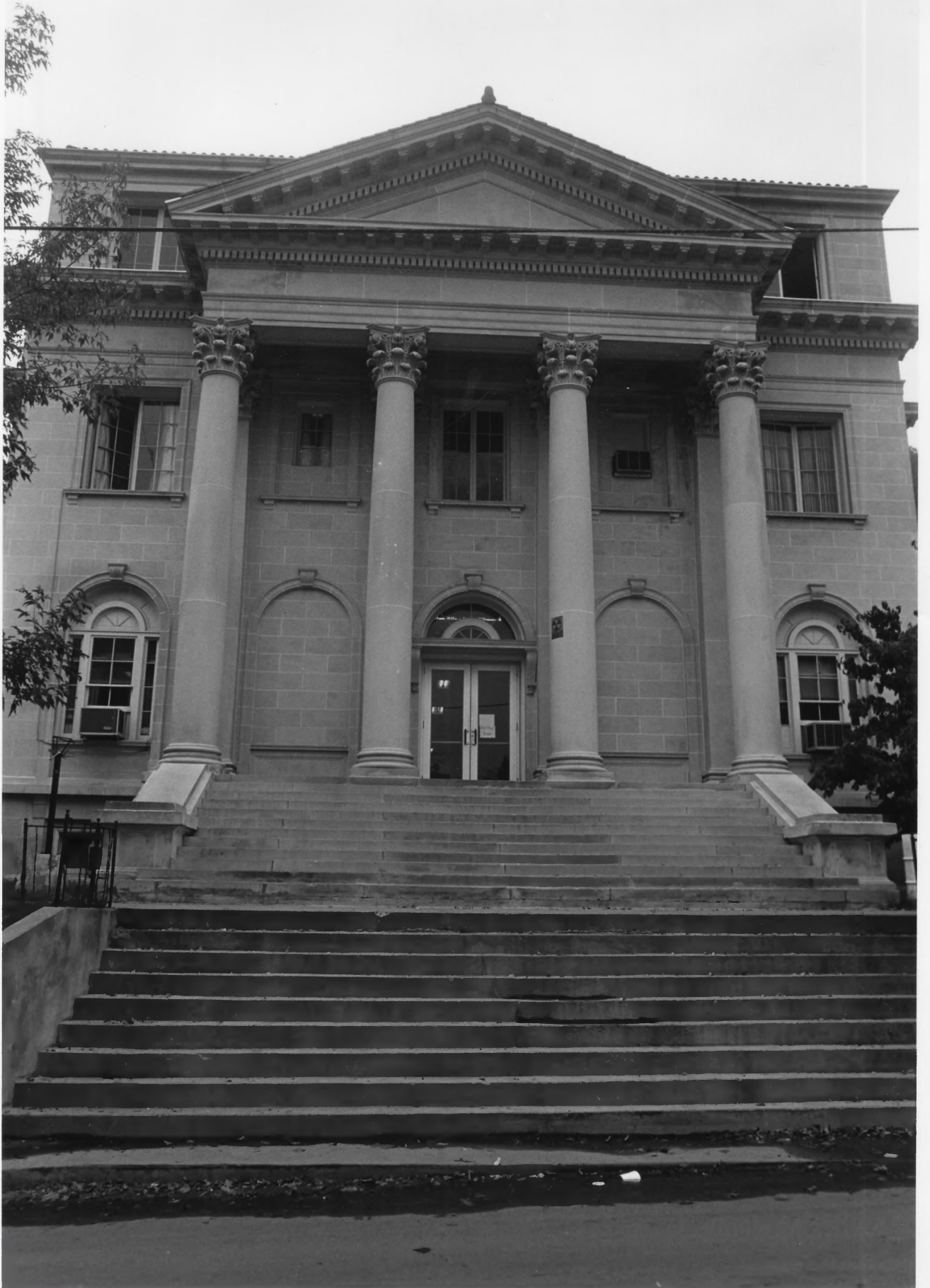
