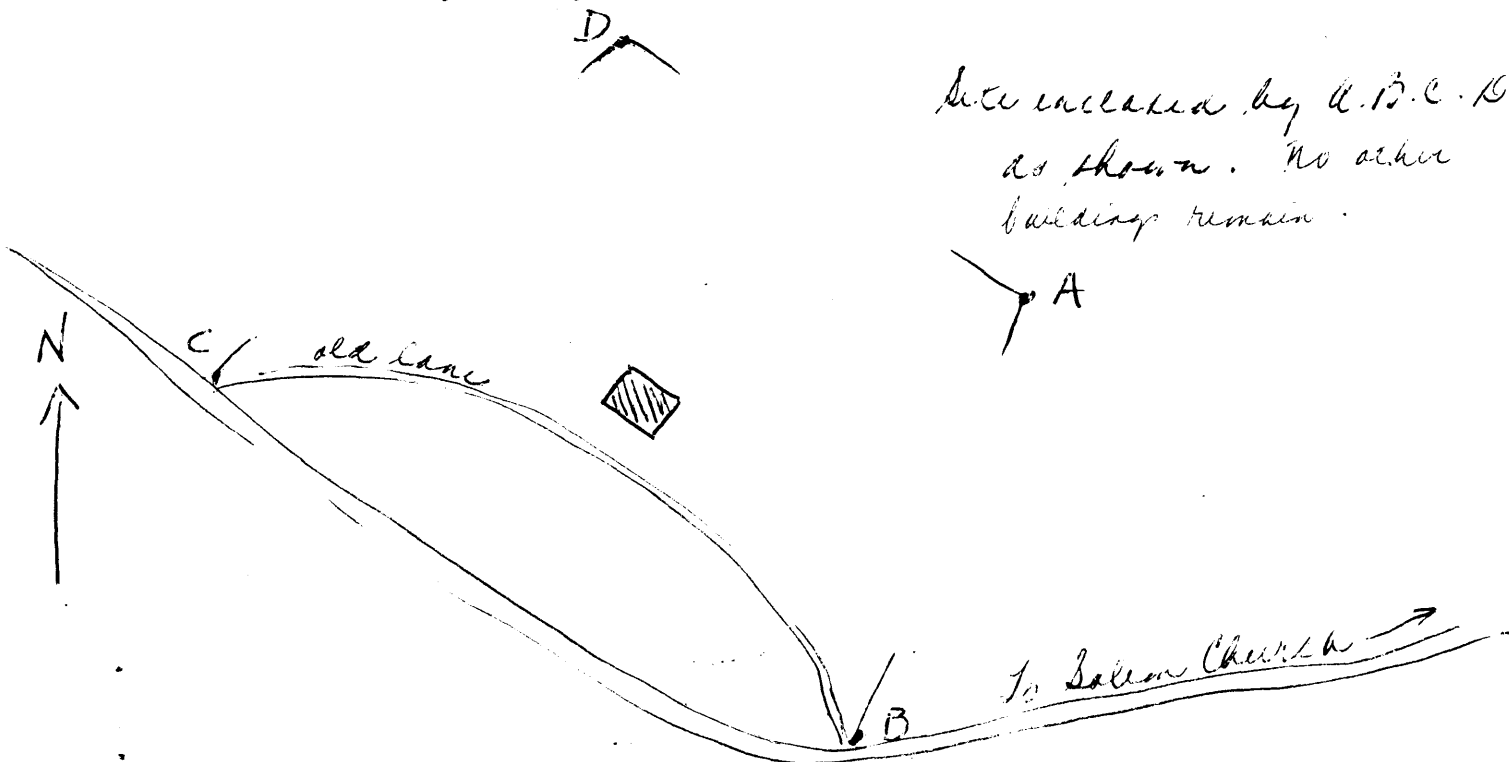

44. Description and House Plan:

Unique one-story, single cell, dry stone house with exterior gable end chimney. Full cellar with exterior entrance. House had wooden stoop on center of front, in front of the door which was the only opening in the front wall other than cellar. One window only in center of north wall, one window in center of west wall, and fireplace centered in east wall—common plan for primitive log house, but singular in stone. Part of one window frame remains, which has solid board reveal and ovolo trim.

Said by descendant to have had ladder-like stair to upstairs bedroom, which had small square windows (presumably in gable ends).
