North facade has double 2/2 double-hung windows; same cornice on brackets and gable end with small window and board and batten trim. Central brick chimney. House is set high on slope between N. Main and N. Adams Streets. House exterior is in need of repair, but architectural integrity and most decorative elements are intact.
