7. Description

Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The W. H. Watt Building is a two-story rectangular commercial building with vertical massing and a steeply pitched street-facing gable. The rear section of the building is one story, also with a gable roof. The building's brick walls are laid in common bond. The front gable space is faced with geometrically patterned metal siding. On the first-story front the building is divided into three vertical bays. The central entrance is flanked by large sash windows with fixed Queen Anne-style upper lights and segmental relieving arches. The second story displays a large central door (originally a window), also with a segmental relieving arch. The only other apparent out-of-period alteration is a circa-1968 two-story porch with turned posts. This porch spans the front of the building, but it does not The Carbonate obscure the historically significant features of that facade. Street facade has several windows and two doorways, all with segmental relieving An interior brick chimney is placed at the junction of the one- and twoarches. story sections of the building.

The building is detached from its neighboring commercial buildings to the south. On the west and north sides it fronts Main and Carbonate streets. The nomination includes the W. H. Watt Building and its city lot. The building nearly fills that lot except at the rear, where there are no additional buildings or significant landscaping features.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The W. H. Watt Building is architecturally significant as a rare example of early brick architecture in Hailey. An 1889 fire that demolished the business district of Hailey left few buildings still standing. The rear portion of the Watt building, which may date from as early as 1882, is the only known extant brick survivor of the fire. (Two brick buildings outside the business district, the Alturas Hotel and the Blaine County Courthouse, date from 1883. The front portion of the building probably dates from just after the fire, when a major rebuilding effort began. Features representative of the period include the gable front, the use of pressed sheet iron, the symmetrical facade, double-hung sash windows that are smaller than the large display windows just becoming popular, vertical massing, and the use of brick. Historic photographs of Hailey show that many commercial buildings from this period shared these features. The Watt Building is connected in local memory with W. H. Watt, who had the building erected as a bank. Dr. Robert Wright acquired the building in 1914 and used it for his medical practice until 1965.
