The Belfast National Bank, constructed in 1879, is a small two-and-a-half story brick building, typical of the type of commercial building erected in this area in the mid-nineteenth century. The building has a mansard roof with intersecting gables over the original entrance pavillion. This section, which was once the original entrance, is very decorative, especially at the gables which are crested.

The windows on the first floor are modern store windows. On the second floor they are double hung with carved lintels over each. The dormers on the roof are gable type with pointed arched windows. The roof itself is covered with slate shingles.

The building was extended along Main Street in 1891 with the addition of two bays to bring it to its present size. The addition was done in the same style as the original building.

At present, the building contains stores on the first floor and two offices on the second floor. The building is in good condition.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Belfast National Bank is one of the finest and more elaborately decorated commercial buildings surviving in the State of Maine. Also unusual is the fact that it is roughly triangular in shape.

The building was erected in 1878-79 and was designed by George M. Harding of Boston. The master builder was Israel Wood Parker of Belfast. These are the same two gentlemen who designed and built the Masonic Hall in Belfast.

The personnel of the Belfast National Bank moved into this building in 1879 from quarters in the Johnson Block which they had occupied since 1857.

This superb piece of commercial architecture sets in the midst of many other early and late nineteenth century commercial buildings in the City of Belfast. This building and other commercial buildings represent the commercial growth of a city which grew up as a seaport in the heyday of Maine's commercial power and importance.
