


Physical Description

A variety of textures, natural materials and earth colors causes this handsome house to blend pleasantly into its lush green setting, well landscaped and ringed by towering shade trees. The one-and-one-half-story house features a prominent tile clipped gable end roof which swoops low to provide shady, overhanging eaves lined with exposed rafters. To one side, a cross gable projection forms the front porch and just to the rear of it, a large gable roof dormer appears. The steep slant of these two intersecting gable roofs on the front elevation lends a cottage-like, rather picturesque effect to the composition. The structure is faced with dark reddish brown brick and all the gables are enriched with stucco, half-timbering effects and large brackets. As in many other Thompson firm houses, the once open front porch supported by simple brick piers is now screened in. An unusual chimney which tapers inward as it rises marks the north elevation. Most windows in the house are multi-paned casement windows.

Statement of Significance

The Shull House in Lonoke, Arkansas was designed by the Thompson and Harding firm in 1917. Located across the street from the city park, the Shull House is a good example of the earthy comfortable feeling of Craftsman design. The dark red brick house features a tile clipped gable roof. Also contributing to the rich texturalism of the Shull House are the gables which feature stucco, half-timbering and large brackets. The setting, so abundant with large trees and vegetation provides a lush, dark atmosphere for this homey cottage-like house.


