quoined corners. Enclosed corner stair
arise from front of hall, now arises from
front of parlor. Partition wall is a stud wall
w mortared brick nogging, horizontal rail
every 7 courses. Beaded ceiling joists (now
covered), 1st and 2nd floors, untrimmed log
joists below 1st floor. 2 upstairs doors have
H-L hinges & leather washers. Raised 6 panel
doors, 1/4 rnd. mold, chair rail upstairs, paneled
jambs, pegged rafters.

Changes include removal of chair rail on 1st
floor, wide baseboard, 19th C. mantel, chimney (photo 5)
tops rebuilt w brick, some sash changed, rear
door blocked, eaves extended, outside painted (photo 1)
white.

Stone wing c. 1810 w exterior end chimney
has ~~beaded~~ Federal mantel, beaded joists.
Corner stair to room above only. Access doorway
to this wing set in N end wall of house. Long
front window opening, sprayed, poss. a door?
Dormers added.

Brick kitchen w exterior end chimney, on
N end of house originally was connected to the
wing by an open dog trot and had porch across
front. ~~Stuccoed~~. (rebuilt)

Beyond kitchen is a log ~~structure~~ ^{dependency}. (photos 7, 8)

House located on nice facing branch of
Clear Creek.

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A where the creek branch goes under the road (169) thence N along road to the fence at B 260 ft, thence with fence W 600 ft to C, thence S 400 ft perpendicular to fence & outside garage to D, thence E parallel to B-C fence to creek bank & with creek to the beginning, containing the house, log building and garage. about 4 acres
