45. Description and House Plan:

The simple gable-front <u>building</u> features a regular, tiered placement of pointed-arch windows, four bays on the two sides and three bays on the front and back. Part of the interior, above the door, is occupied by a balcony. All the windows are double-hung sash, consisting of opaque glass surrounded by small panes of colored glass. A semioctagonal, one-story bay projects beyond the plane of the wall in the center of the rear of the building. The foundation is quarried stone in even courses, topped with a projecting wooden water table. The chief decorative detail, drawn from the Queen Anne style, is in the front, incompared ornament and the gabled hood over the door, built of chamfered wooden elements and filled with ppanels pierced with delicate stems and leaf shapes. The space between the building and the higher elevation of the roadway has been paved with concrete to encourage water runoff. There is a small wooden privy to the southwest of the church, built at about the same time as the church.
