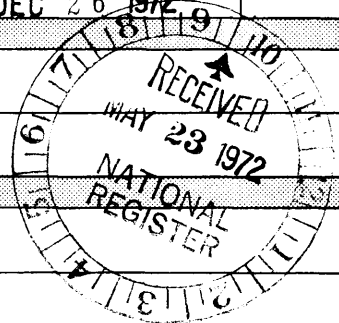

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The West Home represents a style of architecture which can be seen in at least one other house in Marianna dating from approximately the 1840's. The Florida climate was taken into consideration in the plan of the house, resulting in a very wide central hall terminating in double doors at the front and rear. This allows for a breeze to cool the hall and adjacent rooms. Originally separate, the kitchen is now attached to the main house. The only other major alteration has been an extension of the portico from the ends of the gable out to the ends of the house. This involved the addition of four more columns. The West Home represents distinct characteristics of both the Greek revival and Victorian styles of architecture as they developed in this area. The original portico with its six Doric columns, framing pilasters, transom and sidelights are all fairly typical of the Greek style as is the use of pilasters to divide the front wall into panels. The steeply pitched roof and cross gable reflect a later period. The house is of clapboard with the exception of the back wall of the porch and the area within the gable. These have flush siding. All windows are sash, six over six, with louvered exterior shutters. Two brick chimneys are placed slightly to the front of the roof ridge.

The house presents a very modest appearance, situated as it is in the center of a large tree shaded lot. It does, however, reflect a very livable and well adapted plan, dating from quite an early date. The house has been in continuous use since its construction and due to constant upkeep it is in excellent condition.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The West Home is believed to date from approximately the 1840's, however, the exact date of construction cannot be verified. Research indicates that Edward W. Peyton sold the land on which the house sits to John Davis on September 4, 1833 (Deed Book, Jackson County Courthouse). It is assumed that Davis built the present house sometime before 1876 when the property (Lot 10 and 21 with a house) was transferred to Theophilus West. Davis had reportedly built the house when he married Rebecca Spears, but due to some unknown circumstances they never occupied the structure. It was not until after her husband's death when Rebecca remarried Dr. West that she was to occupy the house on Putnam Street.

In addition to being architecturally interesting from an eclectic standpoint, the house is associated with the life of a person significant in local history. Dr. Theophilus West was a prominent physician and druggist who came to be one of Marianna's most esteemed citizens. Born in Leon County, he received a medical degree from Oglethorpe Medical College in Savannah, Georgia. Coming to Marianna in 1859, he set up a medical practice only to have it interrupted by the war. He enlisted as an assistant surgeon in the Eighth Florida Regiment and was paroled at Appamatox Courthouse when Lee surrendered. His parole papers now hang in the upstairs den of the home. Returning to Marianna after the war, Dr. West pursued his profession from his home. In addition to being the first superintendent of public schools for Jackson County he was mayor for a brief period. After the death of his first wife he married Louise Slade and they had two children one of whom is Charles Slade West, current owner of the home.

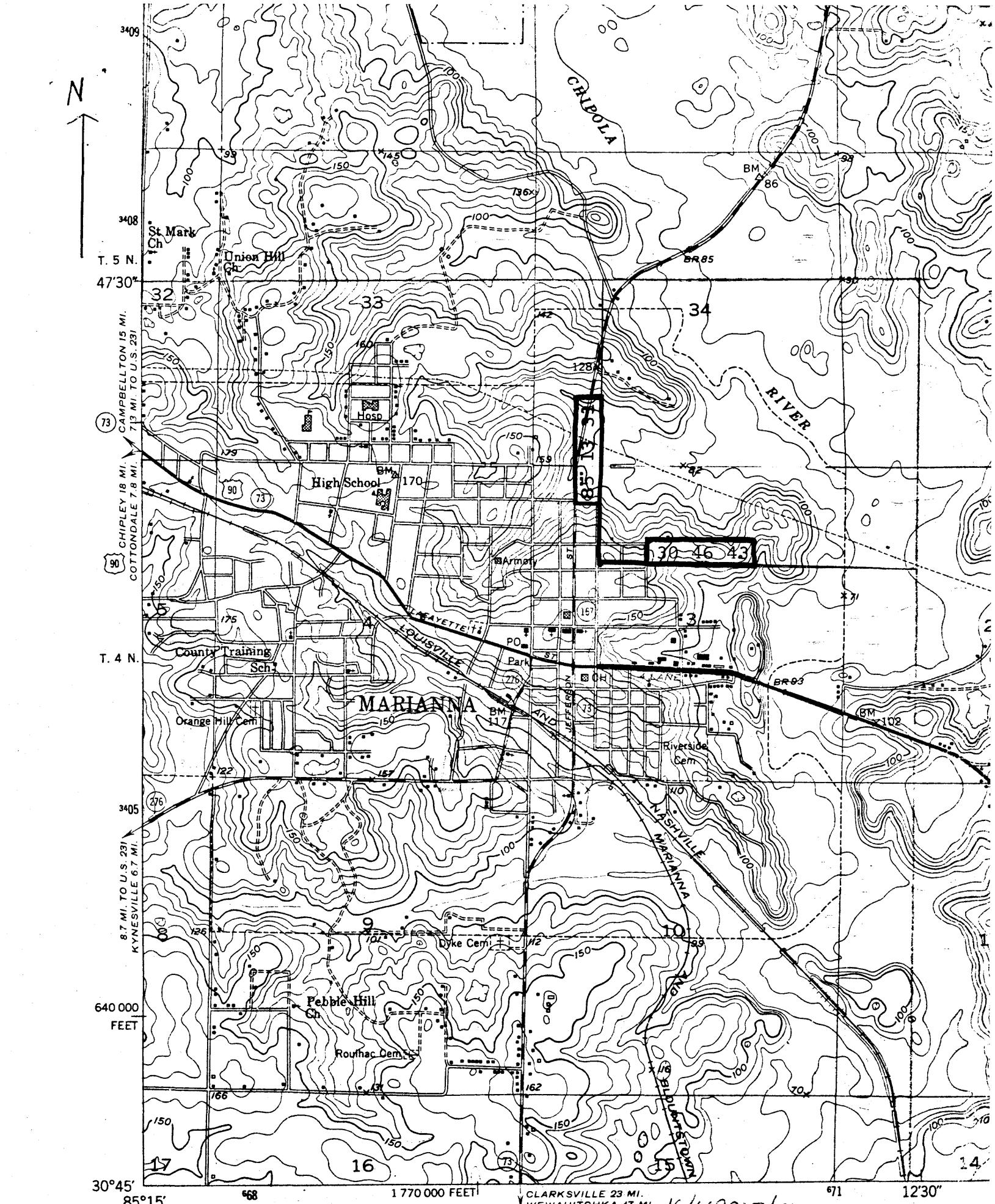
