DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Bloss Home was built in 1914 at a cost of \$11,930. It was designed by Bedesen & Cowell, Architects from the City of Merced, Ca., and built by Wilcox & Groom.

The building is a two-story concrete structure, comprising a total of 4,710 square feet (2,012 on the first floor, 2,012 sq.ft. on the second floor, and a partial basement of 686 square feet).

Outside the exterior building walls are 1,975 square feet of outside living area as follows:

First Floor:

1 Pergola of 237 sq.ft. with 6 columns

1 Rear Porch of 120 sq.ft. with 3 columns 1 Front Porch 192 sq.ft. with 8 columns 1 Side Porch of 309 sq.ft. with 10 columns

the front porch.

Accessory Buildings, detached but on the same site are:

1 Tank House, 14' x 14', same construction, tile roof

and height as the main building, and

1 Garage, 20' x 22', used by the Bloss Family.

Other accessory buildings on the same site are

1 Residence for the Gardner and his Family (and still occupied by them), and 1 garage for the gardner's family, but detached from his residence. Frame construction and siding.

An elevator tower was added to the house at some later date. It was designed to harmonize with the architectural character of the building, and does not detract from the original design.

The adjacent formally landscaped park was part of the original grounds of the

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The George Bloss Family was very community-minded, and has shaped the history of this area. The Bloss Mansion is significant architecturally and for its association with this prominent local family. At the age of 10, George Bloss and his family moved to Merced County from Connecticut. The year was 1884, and the site is now the City of Atwater. George Bloss was involved in cattle ranching from 1894 until 1954, when an equilibrium disorder brought that career to an end.

Shortly after George Bloss married Christine Thompson, he had this house built for her in 1914. George Bloss worked actively in the interest of the community, and served as Atwater's first Mayor after he was instrumental getting the City incorporated in 1922. A total of 600 votes were cast.

George Bloss died in 1963, leaving "Bloss Home" to the City of Atwater for public use after his wife's demise. Christine passed on in 1971.

The Atwater Historical Society had the house listed as a Historical Point of Interest in the State of California in honor of the Bloss family, who gave so much to the community.

The Bloss family also deeded to the community the Bloss Memorial Library, the Women's Club House, Bloss Hospital, a church, a school, the "plunge", city park and fire house, and established a scholarship which is known as the "Bloss Memorial Scholarship".

The Atwater Historical Society is presently in the process of attempting to furnish the house in the period of the turn of the century when Bloss Home was built. The Atwater Chamber of Commerce and the Atwater Historical Society now have their offices in the Bloss Home, which is open to the public. Tours are being conducted, and the building and the beautiful garden served many public and private functions, including wedding ceremonies.

In 1977 the then Mayor of Atwater attempted to return Bloss Home back to the Estate, because it costs the taxpayers money for maintenance and repairs without bringing in any revenues. A public outcry could prevent this. The people collected 2,551 signatures within a very few days, declaring "their support and interest in preserving the historical significance of the Bloss Home for the present and future generations", requesting that the City of Atwater keep title to the Bloss Home and adjacent Bloss Park.

The Bloss House, set in its spacious landscaped grounds, is the most important design statement of the early 20th century in this small Central Valley farming community. It reflects several architectural trends which were popular during the period. The influence of the California Mission Revival can be seen in



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the overall form of the building with its hipped tile roof and stucco exterior. Prairie Style influences are evident in the horizontal emphasis of the building, the broad eaves, and numerous three-part "Chicago" windows. A formal appearance is created by Classical elements skillfully integrated into the composition in the imposing entrance portico and the large side porch on the west; both utilize heavy Tuscan columns to support classical entablatures capped by ballustrades. The resultant building is the finest example of residential architecture in the city of Atwater.
