

This house, while having been altered through the years, still retains a sufficient amount of its original fabric that it should be recognized and retained. This house stands within the northern boundary of the Isaac Kingsland Patent of May 12, 1687 which contained 500 acres and is on one of the first roads of the County. The area became known as Hoppertown prior to the Revolution due to the prevalence of the Hopper families in the area; this may have been one of their houses. No more is known. - CKT
