Description

Cotton gins are directly involved in the processing of cotton. Because utility and efficient operation are their primary concerns, they are generally void of stylistic detailing. Their importance, however, lies within their function.

The Stipe Cotton Gin is no exception to this. It is a two-story, cross-gable roofed, rectangular, steel frame structure, sheathed in corrugated metal, which houses the compressor essential to the processing of cotton. The compressor is a steam-powered baling device which pressed the cotton into five hundred pound bales which were then ready for shipment.

Attached to the west elevation of the structure is a one-story, shed roofed drive which encloses the scales which were used to determine the weight of the bales of cotton. Just north of the scales is a structure the original use of which is unknown. Because of its proximity to the main building, it is assumed that this structure was used as a chute which dispensed cotton by-products to waiting vehicles. This structure is circular in shape and constructed of riveted sheet metal. It is supported by a steel frame. Fenestration on this side of the structure consists of nine-pane fixed frame windows as well as six-pane awning windows.

A one-story, shed roofed drive runs the entire width of the north elevation. Located above the shed roof are two, six-pane awning windows while two sliding, corrugated metal doors are located below it. Fenestration on the east elevation is similar to that of the west.

There is, however, one addition. A sheet metal pipe connects the main building with the boiler which is located to the north across Cypress St. This circular structure is constructed of riveted sheet metal and rests on a continuous cast concrete foundation. The boiler provided steam power for the machinery within the cotton gin building. Southeast of the main building is the Seed Hopper. The two original hoppers have been replaced but the steel frame supports still remain intact.

The Seed Storage Building lies to the east of the main building. This one-and-one-half-story, frame, single crib with side drives is clad with corrugated metal and is largely intact. It rests on a continuous cast concrete foundation. All windows, and most door openings, have been covered up with plywood. While this complex is currently abandoned it is still in good condition.

Significance

Around 1930, when this gin was constructed, all harvested cotton from local farmsteads was brought here for initial processing. During this period, cotton was the predominant crop in White County and it was one of the top cotton producing counties in the state. The Stipe Cotton Gin is but one of only five historic cotton gin complexes remaining in the county which date from this prosperous period. This cotton gin is significant also because of the role it played in the development and history of the surrounding community. Much of the agricultural potential of the surrounding area was realized through the operation of this facility. This gin served the needs of not only the residents of Beebe but the surrounding areas as well.

The boundaries of this property are presently located along building lines. A resource listed in the National Register should include all features of the property which contribute to its significance. In almost all cases this includes its historic setting. Page 77 of National Register Bulletin 16, Guidelines for Completing National Register of Historic Places Forms, states that "the boundaries of buildings should include the land surrounding the building, unless the lot occupied by the building contains no surrounding land as in the central business district of most cities."

Please revise the boundaries to include the property historically associated with the resource. If a portion of the original setting has lost its integrity, please explain.

Please clarify the count of contributing and non-contributing resources. Are the chute, boiler and seed storage building considered non-contributing? It sounds like they were important to the operation of the gin and may have been constructed during the period of significance.

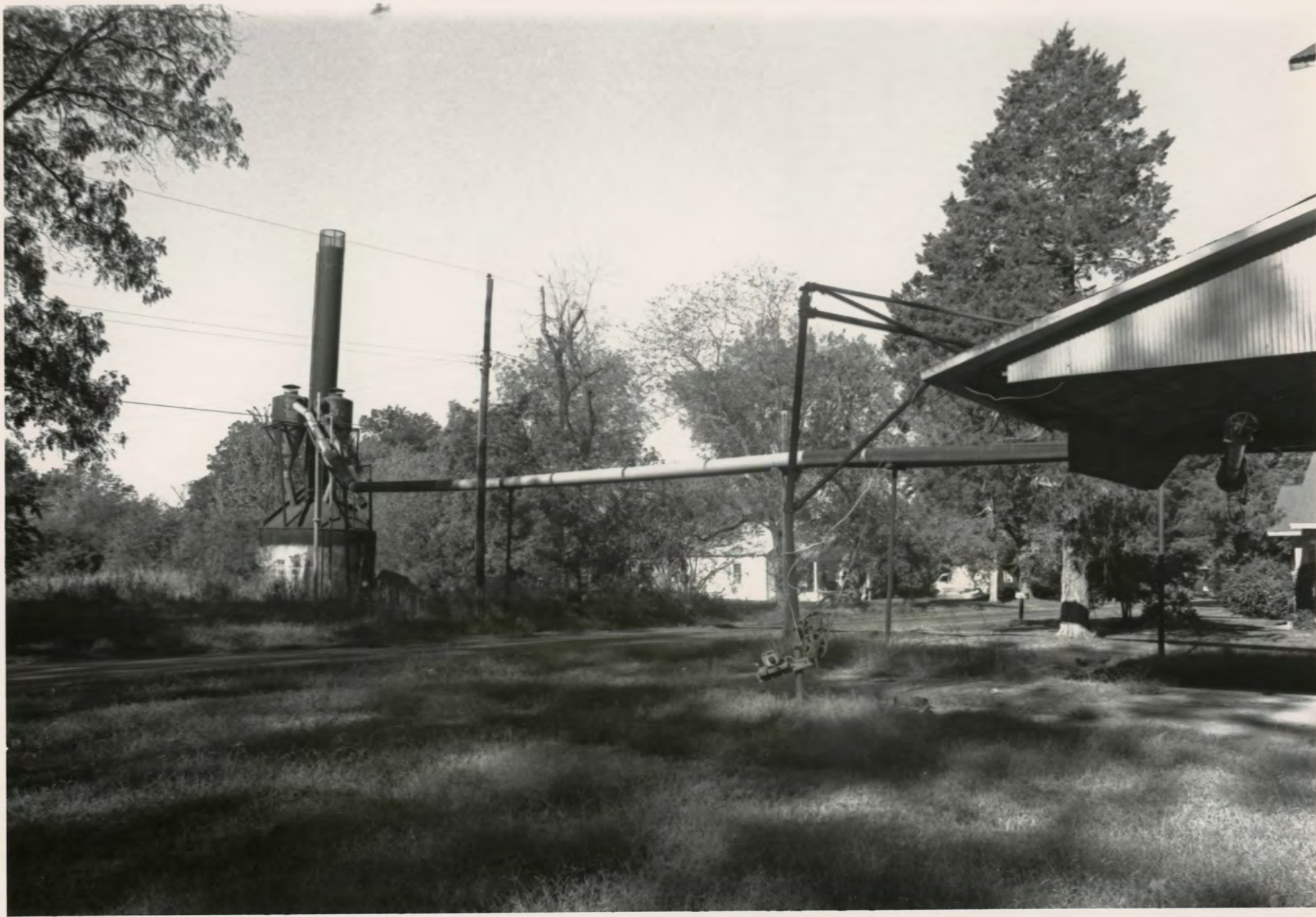
