20. Significance Important to history of Clark County are the late eighteenth century stone buildings, which represent one of the first substantial construction types in the area. This one, believed to have been first owned by Zachary Elkin is part of the Two Mile Creek settlement area, and is an example of a single room plan with enclosed passage, and is one of the earliest surviving houses in the county.		21.
