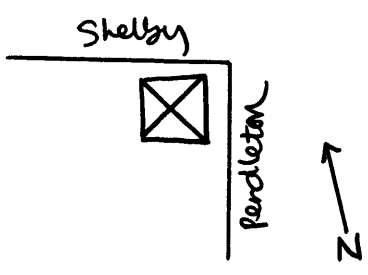

Narrow wood string courses between first and second and second and 2 1/2 floors. Two bay front, door at left has transom, fluted frame with corner blocks. Windows have same trim. Most windows (over)

18 continued : are double, divided by fluted pilasters. Diamond shaped window in east facade, below stair. Overhanging eaves, box cornice. Gable ends have decorative trim--front gable end has decorative bargeboard with a horseshoe shaped inset, finial and pendant. East gable end has bargeboard only. West facade has 2-story bay windows, gable end has bargeboard with fan-shaped inset, finial and pendant. Brick porch at front replaced earlier wooden porch. Shed addition and deck on south facade. Interior is four room plan, left front is stair hall. All original woodwork is intact--door trim, sliding doors between rooms, mantels, stair carved with pendant trim. All wood upstairs is grained, fireplaces are marbled metal.
