DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Of the original fourteen adobe buildings, six now stand as a museum and monument to the early military efforts within what is now Colorado.

The fort was constructed in 1858 to replace Fort Massachusetts, six miles to the north. At that time the area was part of the Territory of New Mexico. General construction was adobe plastered with mud and whitelime. Roofs were of sod while floors were laid board. The arrangement of the buildings formed a rectangle about the parade ground with an ice house located near a pond.

Today, the officers' quarters and the barracks stand. Highway 159 dissects the original grounds to the east and pass over the area where the hispital stood.

In 1945, the citizens of San Luis Valley presented the land and the fort to the State Historical Society of Colorado for use as a regional museum. Since that time, restoration of the remaining buildings has taken place; the exhibits of military life have been installed; and rooms have been refurnished to the period when Kit Carson was in command of the facilities.

Fort Garland was constructed in 1858 as a replacement of the camp known as Fort Massachusetts which was six miles to the north. At that time the area was part of the Territory of New Mexico. Fort Garland was named after the commander of the Territory of New Mexico, Colonel Brevet Brigadier General John Garland. The original units which constructed the Fort were Company E, U. S. Mounted Riflemen; and Company A, 3rd U.S. Infantry.


The purpose of the Fort was as a base of operations against hostile Indians and to protect the settlers of the San Luis Valley. During the outbreak of the Civil War, the Fort was manned by volunteers; the regulars participating in the main theaters of the War. In 1866, Colonel Kit Carson with a regiment of New Mexico Volunteers was assigned to man Fort Garland. He stayed until the summer of 1866 when the Volunteers were mustered out. The critical period following the Meeker Massacre at White River Agency in 1879 saw a tremendous increase in the number of men garrisoned at Fort Garland. At one time, camping in the area, were 1500 troops. With the coming of more peaceful times, the Fort was abandoned in 1883.

Today, the Fort Garland site belongs to the State Historical Society of Colorado which has utilized the facilities, after restoration, as a regional museum to the public. The story of the military, its impact on settlement in the area and its role in Indian affairs, as they concern Colorado, are presented to the visitor.
