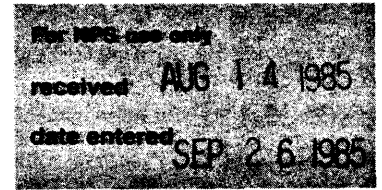

4. Owner: Gilbert Pino, P.O. Box 2743, Las Vegas, N.M.
7. Description: Dark brown, random ashlar sandstone foundation; wood shingles over intersecting gables and shed roofs; small enclosed eave overhangs; 2/2 double-hung windows with small framing boards (front) or recessed with wood lintels (rear); single door with transom; lathe-turned porch columns and wood railing, stickwork in gable.

Located just northeast of the North New Town District, this stucco over wood frame and adobe house stands next to two other nominated houses (#s 294, 295), facing the Second Street Triangle Park (#2023), and beyond it U.S. 85 and some more recent strip commercial buildings.

8. Significance: Built about 1885, the front portion of this house is a very good, unaltered example of the L-shape variety of the Wood Vernacular house type. The rear addition of adobe was added soon after. This house along with two more houses immediately north and the triangular park which they face on (ill. 73)--all of which are nominated separately--present a still-coherent piece of the historic fabric. They developed as a modest residential park like Library Park before the designation of U.S. 85 turned Grand Avenue into a major thoroughfare.
