## ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION:

One-and-a-half-story gable-roof frame residence with pedimented tetrastyle portico. Entablature and boxed cornice continue to side facades to form pedimented gables. Center-hall plan; hall originally opened onto three-bay rear gallery with small rooms at each end. This gallery has been enclosed.

Concrete block storeroom added to southwest corner.
