Summary

Constructed in 1916 within the boundaries of the Oak Hill Cemetery, the Oak Hill Mausoleum is a single-story, granite and marble masonry funerary building designed in a heavy, Neoclassical idiom common for such construction throughout the United States during the first decades of the twentieth century. Its flat roof and symmetrical plan are complimented by the low, horizontal massing and symmetrical fenestration.

Elaboration

Constructed in 1916 within the boundaries of the Oak Hill Cemetery, the Oak Hill Mausoleum is a single-story, granite and marble masonry funerary building designed in a heavy, Neoclassical idiom common for such construction throughout the United States during the first decades of the twentieth century. Its flat roof and symmetrical plan are complimented by the low, horizontal massing and symmetrical fenestration.

The eastern or front facade is completely symmetrical, as are all four sides of the exterior. The taller central section is flanked by a pair of lower wings that contained the original seventy-two crypts (since removed). The central, double-leaf entrance is ornamented with a simple surround and the wall above is fenestrated with three rectangular openings for stained glass. The flanking pilasters are decorated with central, projecting thin panels near the stepped-back cornice and projecting stone stoops that flank the entrance. The flanking wings are decorated with cornerblocks containing incised paterae that feature a stylized flower blossom.

The northern, southern and western elevations are all simpler, with the sloping water table and descending stone quoins being the only detail of note. Stained-glass clerestory window openings are placed into the wall of the raised central section on the northern and southern sides, and two large stained-glass windows are placed symmetrically in the western or rear wall. A single stone chimney rises above the parapet on the western wall.

The interior is largely finished in marble, though the upper level is covered with plaster decorated with delicate stenciling. The only significant alteration to the building has occurred on the interior, consisting entirely of the removal of the original burials within the flanking sections. Once removed, the entrances to these crypt areas were covered with wallboard.

Summary Criterion C, local significance

The Oak Hill Mausoleum was constructed by the Southwestern Mausoleum Company in 1916 near the center of the Oak Hill Cemetery in Siloam Springs. Its heavy stone masonry construction and Neoclassical style are uncommon in

western Benton County, and mausoleums in general are not common in Arkansas. Because of its status as a rather elaborate and relatively unaltered example of the Neoclassical idiom, it is being nominated under Criterion C.

Elaboration

The Oak Hill Cemetery remains Siloam Springs' oldest burial ground, with burials dating as far back as 1875, when this community was known as Hico. Today the cemetery contains approximately 9,500 total burials, with about 2,400 being over fifty years old. The Oak Hill Mausoleum stands roughly in the center of the cemetery, easily dominating this open, hilltop site.

Built in March of 1916, the Oak Hill Mausoleum was constructed by the Southwestern Mausoleum Company of Little Rock and designed by a W. C. Barnhardt who worked for this company. Financed by a group of interested local citizens led by a Mr. F. A. Clapp, the mausoleum was originally designed to contain a total of seventy-two burials. It served this function for many years, until the structure itself became so deteriorated that the burials had to be removed and re-interred in the surrounding cemetery. The city then wanted to demolish the building, but a local fundraising effort led by Mr. Charles Morrison raised enough money to restore and preserve this important building. It now serves the community as a chapel.

The Oak Hill Mausoleum remains an outstanding example of the heavy, monolithic Neoclassical style that was common for such funerary structures in the early twentieth century in America. Its massive horizontality, unswerving symmetry and heavy stone construction all recall Classical architecture, and particularly that of ancient Greece. Funerary structures of this quality are not common in northwest Arkansas, and the fact that this particular building was threatened with neglect and demolition only to be preserved by a local, grass roots effort is also noteworthy. Thus the physical integrity and architectural significance of the Oak Hill Mausoleum combine to elevate this historic building to eligibility for the National Register under Criterion C with local significance.




