7. Description:

Located on the north side of State Route 52, the A. Hutchings House (BO-382) is a fine frame representation of the Gothic Revival style in Boyle County, outside of Danville. Sitting only slightly back from the road, the dwelling is found within a domestic yard, fronted by a mid-nineteenth century rock fence to the south (paralleling the road) and wire fencing and bushes on all other sides. Although the residence is associated with a large dairy farm, only the main residence and associated resources in the domestic yard are nominated as the additional acreage does not contribute to the criterion considerations. Included in the nomination are three contributing buildings and one contributing structure.

- 1.) Facing south, the c. 1855 main residence (contributing building) is a two-story, frame L-plan dwelling with a symmetrical appearance across the front facade, with three evenly spaced gables. The asphalt shingle clad roof features three central interior brick chimneys. Original weatherboard siding remains under late-twentieth century vinyl. The house rests on a continuous rock faced mortared stone foundation. The symmetrical front facade is a sourcebook of Gothic Revival adornment with decorative sawn bargeboard along the gable edges, turned porch posts and highly decorative frieze. The central paneled entry is surrounded by multi-pane transom and sidelights. Original windows are 8/8 sash with molded wood surrounds and sills and louvered shutters. The two-story ell extending from the rear (north) wall features two gables at each side and a east wall entry with a one-bay porch with sawn bargeboard and turned wood supports. A one-bay, one-story shed extends from the rear (north) wall of the ell, an early-twentieth century addition with weatherboard siding.
- 2.) Behind the main residence is a late-nineteenth century tenant house (contributing building) built on a shotgun plan, oriented east-west. Sided with vertical boards, the building extends two bays in length and the front gabled roof has standing seam metal. A central front (east) entry is fronted by a full-length front porch with shed roof and square posts. The residence rests on stone pier foundation.
- 3.) Close to the front of the tenant house is a late-nineteenth century **coal shed** (contributing building); a simple box frame building with a shed roof, vertical board siding, and a central entry door on the south (front) facade facing the rear entry of the main residence.
- 4.) Along the front (south) boundary of the property, is a mid-nineteenth century crenelated rock fence (contributing structure), constructed of quarried stone mortared in coursed ashlar pattern.

8. Statement of Significance:

Located within the rural community of Hedgeville, near the Hanging Fork of the Dix River in southeastern Boyle County, the A. Hutchings House (BO-382) is architecturally significant under Criterion C as an important element in the history of Gothic Revival architecture in rural Boyle County. The resource is important to the understanding of the style in the county, its dispersion, and the varieties of the style that remain. Although the Hutchings House has applied vinyl siding, all original decorative wood details characteristic of the Gothic Revival remain, including two porches with trim, label moldings and bargeboard trim at the seven gables. The property maintains good historic integrity through its retention of original plan and design, the majority of its materials, workmanship and setting.

The property is nominated as part of the Multiple Property Listing "Historic and Architectural Resources of Boyle County, Kentucky" under the theme "Domestic Architecture in Boyle County, 1780-1945." The property was constructed c. 1855, the period of significance, for A. Hutchings, a successful stock farmer in southeastern Boyle County. Little is known about Hutchings' personal dealings, however in the 1860 Boyle County Census, Alexander Hutchings, age 44, is listed as a farmer with a \$7,000.00 total land value and a \$2,000 personal estate value. Hutchings occupied the property until his death in the 1890s (Boyle County Order Book 3: 76).

10. Geographical Data:

Verbal Boundary Description:

The A. Hutchings House is located on the north side of State Route 52, approximately two-tenths of a mile west of State Route 590 in the community of Hedgeville. The nominated property includes the main residence and associated domestic acreage (approximately $\mathbf{1}$ acre.) bound to the south by a rock fence and on all other sides by a wire fence. The domestic yard is indicated by the dotted lines within Parcel 15 of Boyle County Property Identification Map 53, located in the Boyle County Property Valuation Administration Office. The map represents a scale of $\mathbf{1}$ " = 600'.

Boundary Justification:

The boundaries include the main residence and associated buildings and structures historically associated with the A. Hutchings property and maintaining good levels of historic integrity. The excluded portion of Parcel 15 was omitted from this nomination as the additional acreage did not contribute to criterion considerations.
