### **DESCRIPTION:**

The McMinnville-Chattanooga Road is a narrow section of roadway located in the mountains in the Savage Gulf Natural Area. The onehalf mile stretch of steep roadway consists of a switchback and stone retaining walls. The road has retained much of its original integrity including the width of the original roadway, the sharp curved switchback, and the dry construction stone retaining walls. This section of the roadway is currently maintained in a state natural area as a hiking trail.

The McMinnville-Chattanooga Stagecoach Road is being nominated under National Register criterion A for its historical significance to Grundy County in the area of transportation. The McMinnville-Chattanooga Stagecoach Road, constructed c.1830 was an important travel route through the mountains and was one of only three stagecoach roads in Grundy County. The road was reportedly built by slave labor and by 1850 was one of several stagecoach lines considered for hook-up with the railroad lines. Near the end of the nineteenth century the McMinnville-Chattanooga Stagecoach Road became a part of the stage line from Nashville to Chattanooga and connected to the railroad lines in Chattanooga. By the beginning of the early twentieth century the railroad became the preferred mode of transportation for intercounty travel. However, the McMinnville-Chattanooga Stagecoach Road continued to be used by local residents who resided in the mountains as a major route into the community centers up to the 1920's when State Route 56 was built.
