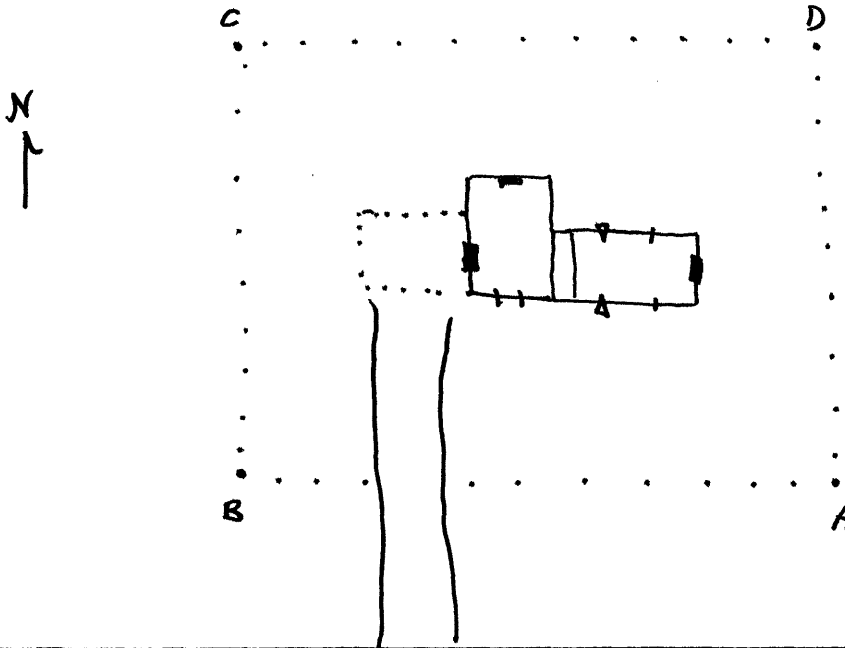

Verbal Boundary Description Acreage .5 ACRE

The designated boundaries define a domestic living space less than one acre with the house in the center. Beginning at point A, thence in a straight line W to point B; thence in a straight line N to point C; thence in a straight line E to point D; thence in a straight line S to point A, the beginning, all boundary lines provide a 30' domestic clearance for the structure.
