



The many old placer mining camps after the exhaustion of the

bench gravels became dormant, but in most instances the gravels of the river and creek bottoms remained intact, as they did not afford the placer miner of old the grade necessary for the disposal of the waste rock. Since the perfection of the gold dredge in California and elsewhere these flat stream gravel deposits in Eastern Oregon have attracted the attention of dredge men, the first modern installation of this type in this neighborhood is the dredge of the Powder Valley Dredging company below Sumpter. The dredge has buckets of nine cubic feet capacity, close connected type and digs into the ground about 15 feet deep, with an approximate monthly output of \$30,000. There is reason to expect that the next few years will see several more dredges successfully established in Eastern Oregon.




