Describe present and historic physical appearance.

The Liberty Theater is a two-storey, reinforced concrete building on the west side of Calle Rafols in the urban center of Quebradillas. It presents a rectangular plan, with its short side facing the street.

The facade is almost square in proportions, and consists of a series of 3 large arched voids (a larger central arch and flanking smaller arches), defining a recessed portico, a simple cornice, a solid parapet, and applied ornamentation. A pitched wood and sheet-metal roof is oriented with its ridge perpendicular to the street and is hidden from view by the facade parapet.

The facade ornamentation is eclectic in character. Along the bottom of the facade, a rusticated base serves as pedestal for the arch piers. Twisted half-column mouldings stem from the base rustication at the arches and support a coarse at the level of the arch imposts.

False concrete stone-facing covers the entire spandrel area between the arcades' imposts and the building cornice. Moulded surrounds frames and the arches above the impost level. Fluted pilaster strips frame the facade borders and support a shallow and simple, concrete cornice. A cameo-shaped medallion with the initials RC is located above each of the smaller arches, and a parchment-motif plaque above the central arch reads the theater's name: LIBERTY.

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and periods of significance noted above.

The Teatro Liberty is a magnificent example of a vernacular non professional interpretation of the architectural trends in vogue in Puerto Rico during the 1920's. The designer of the building was a well known artist, not an architect or engineer, who as a sideline designed small scale or residential structures or facades in the town of Quebradillas. This was Arcilio Rosa's most important and ambitious undertaking. Rosets over the main facades lateral arches present the artists monogram, his signature as in all his paintings.

This building was the first and only performing arts and silent-movie show place in the town. In its stage many local and latin american actors and singers performed for mostly poor, rural population of the region during the theater's period of splendor during the 1920's and 30's. It brought to the masses a cultural experience they would not have enjoyed otherwise. Classic Spanish drama, "zarzuelas", "operetas" were performed by Spanish and local companies as well as amateur presentations by the town's people.

The Teatro Liberty is a local landmark for the people of Quebradillas and the surrounding less fortunate towns who had never had such a place in their communities.

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## National Register of Historic Places Continuation Sheet

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The parapet supports a series of 4 amhorae and an eclectic central, upward projecting ornament consisting of combined angles' wings, scrolls, pineapple and acroterion motifs. The date of construction (1921) and a pair of rosettes or paterae are located under this decorative element at the parapet.

Within the entrance portico three entrance doors lead into the main lobby. The long rectangular plan is divided into 4 consecutives sections in an almost railroad fashion: the portico, the lobby with stairs at either end leading to the balcony and projection room, the orchestra with seating capacity of 380; the stage, with dressing room facilities arranged around its rear and sides.

The lobby contains original, pressed-tin ceilings of Victorian character, imported from the USA. A recently reconstructed wooden wall with two entrance doors divides the lobby from the auditorium.

The auditorium is divided into 3 sections: a central orchestra with various rows of seats, and flanking box seats, separated from the central row by aisles. The box seats are surrounded by a decorative balustrade.

Recently-installed wooden panels decorate the ceiling of the theater area.

All recently-reconstructed or installed elements are the result of a restoration project carried out in 1978.
