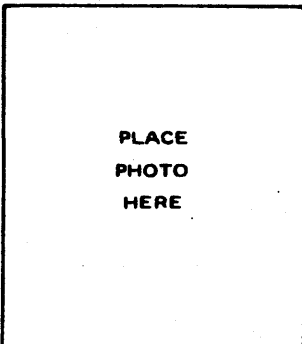

First house on site was owned by Jonathan Hammond - his daughter Mary, married Samuel Treadwell - hence Deacon Treadwell's Mill and Brook. Later owned by Stevens and known by that name.

Architecturally

Right front room does not have a fireplace but does have the brick work with the box-like enclosure to heat water with pit beneath and a bake oven in the brickwork beside it.

Center back room has considerable paneling surrounding the fireplace and full window shutters that slide into the wall.

Left front room has fireplace, more ornate molding and half window shutters.

Y shaped stairway at the front entrance with banisters
