

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Description The Confederate Monument in Oak Grove Cemetery is a simple obelisk, approximately 20 feet tall, and is four feet wide at the base. Theonly ornamentation on the monument is an inscription on the face that reads: "Our Confederate Dead -- 1861-1865." The monument has a small ornamental entryway that includes a low step inscribed with the words: "Confederate Rest. Flanking the step are two small posts about 18 inches high that have a raised Confederate battle flag on them.

Statement of Significance The Confederate Monument in Oak Grove Cemetery meets National Register criterion A and is significant within the context of "Civil War Monuments in Kentucky, 1861-1935." This monument was erected in 1907, probably by the United Daughters of the Confederacy. It was erected in the early part of the 20th Century and is a simple memorial to Confederate soldiers, including six buried adjacent to the monument. This is an excellent example of the property type "obelisk or shaft."

Verbal Boundary Description - The Confederate Monument whose boundaries form a circle with a radius of ten feet centered on the monument located in Oak Grove Cemetery in Paducah, Kentucky.

Verbal Boundary Justification - The area associated with the monument is restricted to the ground on which the monument sits and a small buffer around it. The setting outside such a restricted area is not seen as critically important to maintaining an integrity of association. Because the focus of the multiple property submissions is the significance of the monuments, their proposed area of listing will reflect that they have been considered by-and-large, in isolation from their surrounds.
