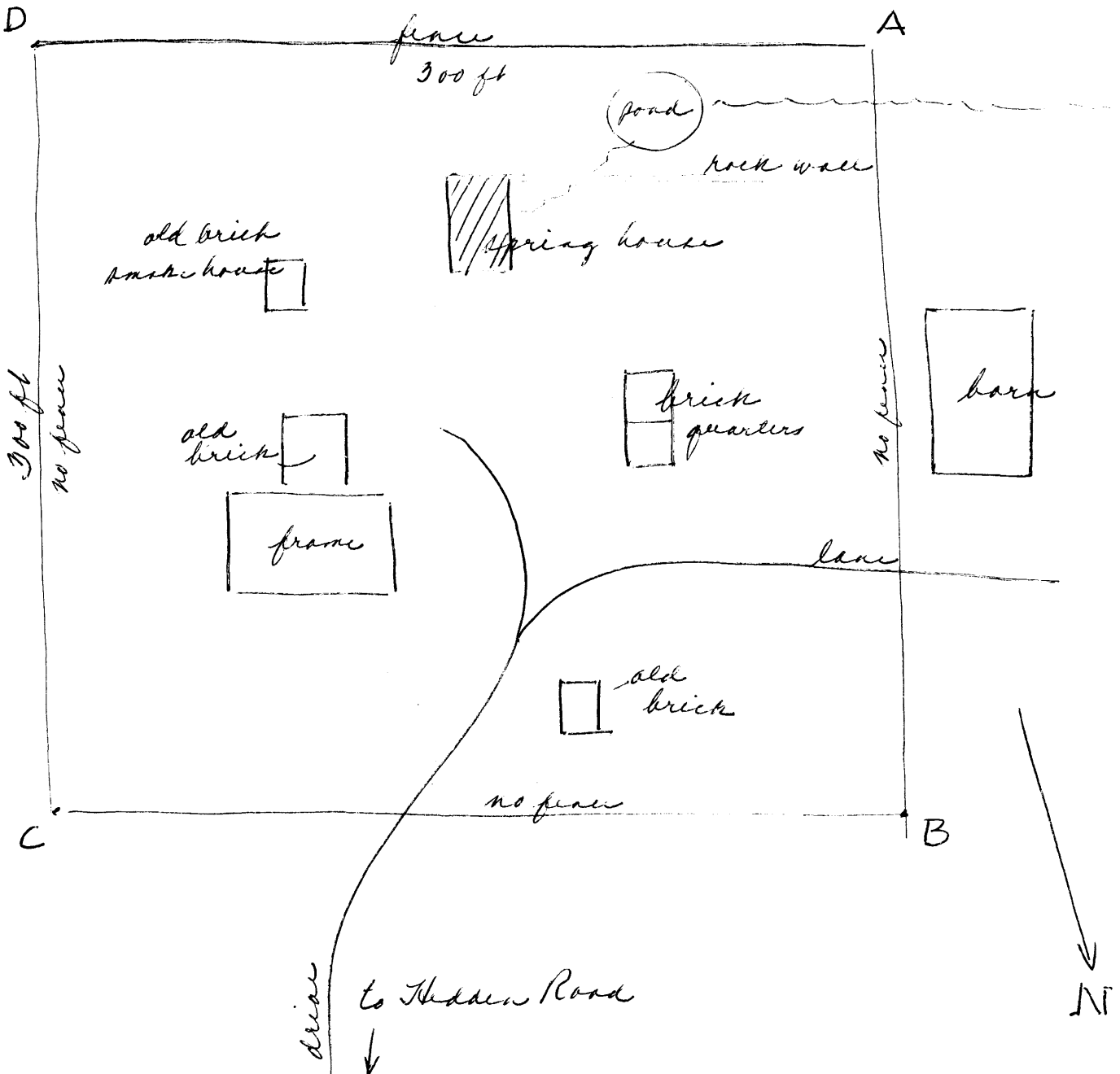
voustiers above it. Top floor at ground level on S and E sides; lower floor contains spring which flows out W side to spring road and branch of Lee's Creek. N. wall of spring house fell out about 3 years ago - contained date stone: "W.B. 1842", which the owners have. Not repointed.

Site includes an ~~early brick~~ ^{frame} house, with early brick all remodelled in Italianate style; brick smoke house; brick slave quarters; another brick dependency and rock wall.

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A in the fence line below the road dam, thence parallel with long wall of Spring house N 300 ft to B, thence at right angles E 300 ft to C, S 300 ft to D at the fence, thence with fence 300 ft to the beginning, containing the Stone Spring house, Spring pond, rock wall, frame house, brick quarters, (over)
