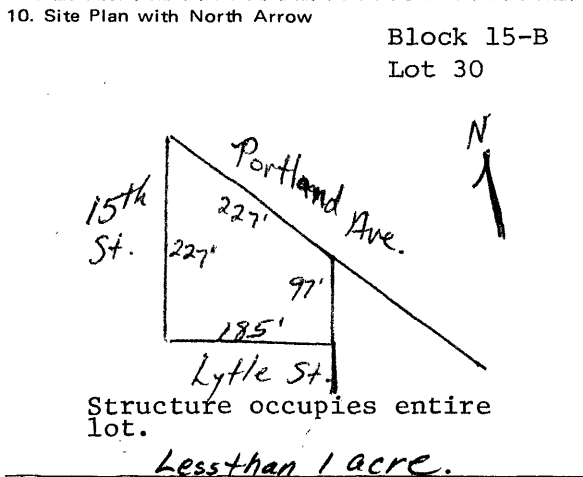

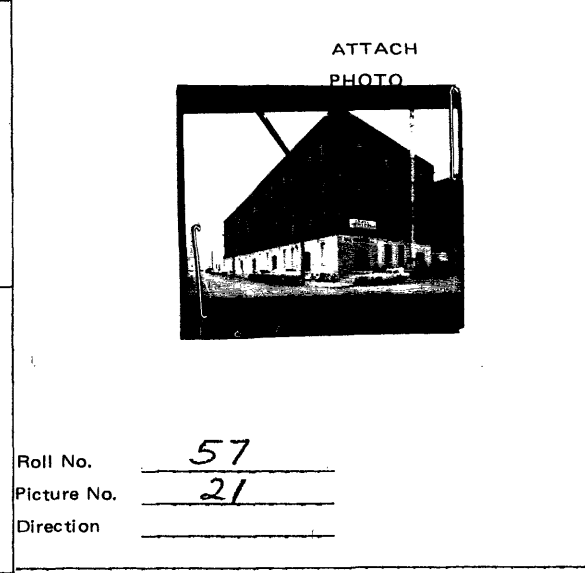

18. Description
 This four story, red brick warehouse occupies an entire block of 15th Street. Its ground story has been painted gray. The 15th Street facade is divided into bays by brick pilasters which are rounded at the points where they join the wall above the top story. Each bay contains a pair of segmentally arched windows, four of which are replaced by loading docks in the first story. All these openings have been boarded over. A (over)
 19. History
 This warehouse was built in 1902 by the Peaslee-Gaulbert, a paint manufacturing company.



20. Significance
 This warehouse was one of a group belonging to Peaslee-Gaulbert which occupied five city blocks. Peaslee-Gaulbert became one of the largest paint manufacturing firms in the country.
