- #30 D. C. Ball House, 300 San Juan, ill. 38.
4. Owner: Agnes Edgar, 300 San Juan.
7. Description: Shiplap over frame; small enclosed eaves with frieze board below; slender porch columns; oriel.
Located on a rise at a street corner in a residential area of more recent or modified houses, two blocks east of the proposed residential district.
8. Significance: Like the previous building, the Daws-Keys House (#316), the D. C. Ball House is one of the few well preserved Hipped cottages remaining in Aztec. Again, the generally symmetrical massing capped by a hipped roof typify the type. The off-center porch with two doors suggests an informal floor plan. The oriel with decorative wood shingle sides also departs from the normal symmetry of the type. Local tradition holds that the house was built in 1901-02 by Jacob Thomas and purchased by Ball in 1916.

Boundary: Lot 1 of Block 3 of the Chavez Addition.
