DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Tye House is situated on the north side of First Street, where the street ends and rolling pasture begins, in Pickens, Mississippi. Traces of a cedar-lined walkway (no longer a part of the Tye House property) lead toward the house south of First Street. The two-story multi-gable frame residence consists of a three-bay facade (south), with a one-story hip-roof veranda carried by Tuscan columns forming a layer around the facade and the length of the east elevation. A make-shift shed porch on the north elevation connects the veranda with a flanking-gable-roof ell. The textural quality of the exterior is enhanced by projecting first-floor window bays on the facade and on the east elevation, with paneled bases, vertical flush-boarded sides and bracketed cornices. A frontispiece entrance is enriched with art glass in the sidelights and transom, and with a beveled-glass-paneled door trimmed with egg-and-dart molding.

In contrast with the picturesque and irregular exterior elevations, the interior of the Tye House is symmetrically arranged with a center hall plan two rooms deep, and a single-run stair to the second floor. Millwork detail is uniform on both floors, with flat-faced architraves and molded backbands. Each of the two front (south) rooms on the first floor has a bay-window niche with an upholstered seating bench and carved screen. The eight extant mantelpieces reveal major nineteenth-century alterations (ca. 1875) to the structure. Mantelpieces on the first floor feature free-standing columns, overmantels, beveled mirrors and decorative trim typical of the Queen Anne and High Victorian Gothic period. On the second floor, mantelpieces are simplified, with pilaster strips supporting a frieze and shelf typical of the Greek Revival period, reflecting the existence of an earlier house (ca. 1850) constructed on the site.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Tye House has important architectural and historical significance for the town of Pickens. Located on the site of an earlier Greek Revival cottage incorporated into the present structure, the house projects a contrasting and eclectic character as a result of its renovation ca. 1875 by Confederate Col. John F. Tye.

According to local historians, a log cabin constructed ca. 1838 on the Tye House site was replaced by a more substantial dwelling ca. 1850 (Tommie Foster, canvasser, Statewide Historical Research Project, Works Progress Administration, 1936; Mississippi Department of Archives and History, Jackson). In 1873 the "commercial firm" of (Thomas) Clark and (Col. J.F.) Tye purchased the house and farm (Holmes Co., Miss., Deed Book 2:296). After the death of Thomas four years later, Col. Tye acquired the entire estate (Deed Book 4:66). Col. Tye was an active civic leader in Pickens and a benefactor who contributed to the town's early growth and development. According to early deeds, Col. Tye conveyed small tracts of property to various religious groups for the construction of places of worship.

The eclectic quality of architecture represented in the Tye House, which may be labeled High Victorian Gothic, is especially significant in the context of its rural setting in the town of Pickens. Characteristic High Victorian Gothic elements include the multi-gable roofline configuration and the application of intricate textural detail such as vertical boarded siding on the exterior window bays and first floor of the facade. Contrasting picturesque and academically inspired mantelpieces on the first and second floors contribute to the architectural significance of the house. Retaining most of the detail associated with Col. Tye's renovation, restoration of the property by the present owners will insure its future preservation.

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
