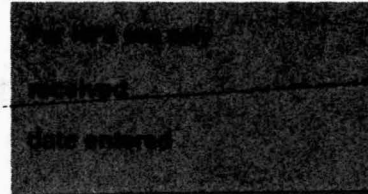

Physical Description

The popular two-story rectangular weatherboard gable roof house is here given a Craftsman influenced appearance. The roof with overhanging eaves features clipped gable ends, an interior end brick chimney and exposed rafters. Accentuating the entrance and forming the front porch is a triangular pediment framed by two large brick piers ornamented with what appear to be projecting beams. This porch extends across the front of the house enclosed by a low wall and accented by exposed rafters. Four narrow casement windows appear over the porch. Other windows on the front elevation are in groups of three. The end of this porch is enclosed in a sunroom with casement windows. The front door has a multi-paned window and multi-paned transom and sidelights as well.

Statement of Significance

Designed in 1912 by the Charles Thompson firm, the Dr. E. H. Johnson House is another variation of the firm's work with the basic rectangular two-story house with gable roof. In this case, in addition to the strong Craftsman details such as the over-scaled brick porch piers with protruding beams, the house shows a clear Prairie Style influence in the clean strong horizontal lines of the roof of the main block and the side porch.

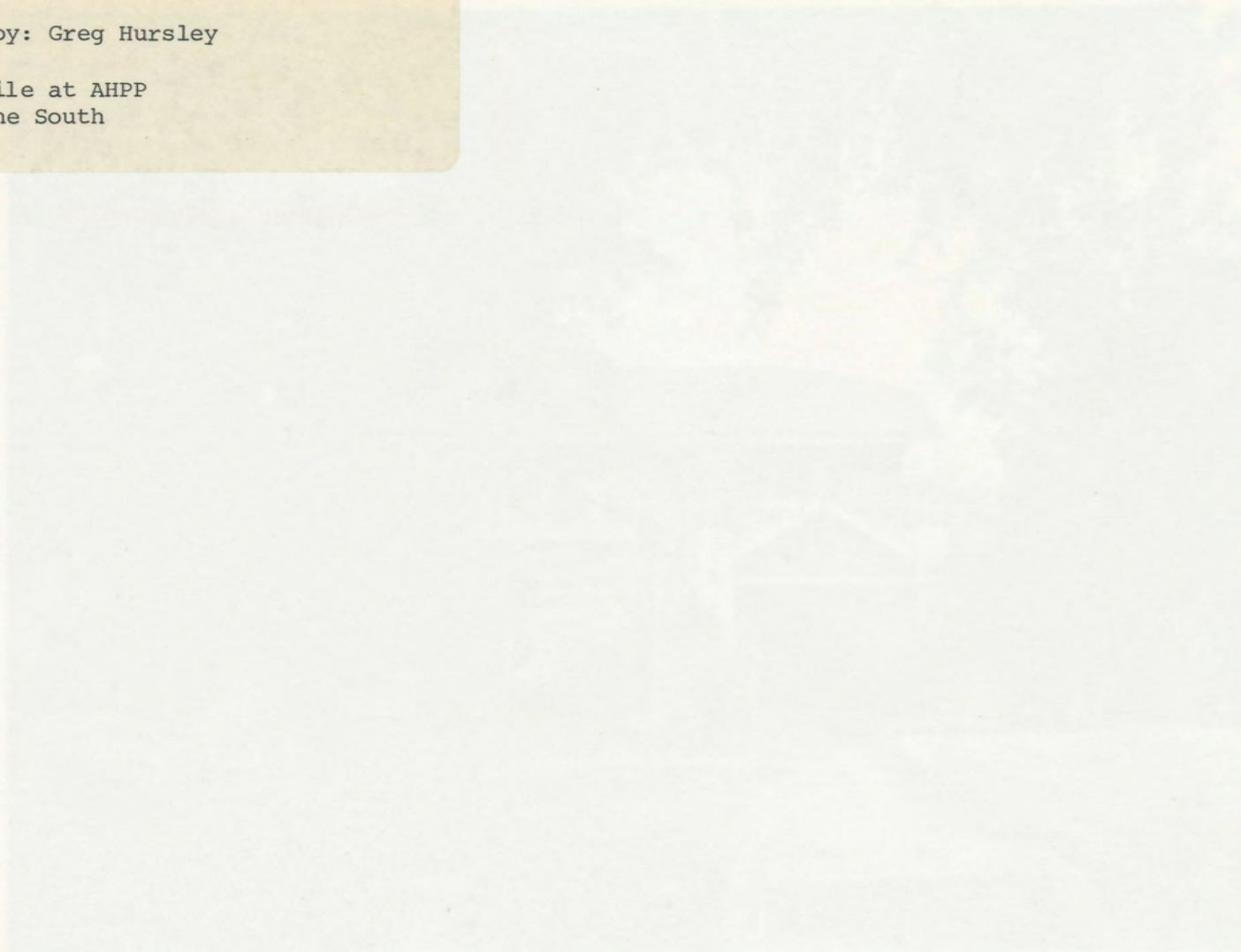
