18. Description
2-story frame "cottage" covered with "fish-scale" shingles, with the upper story actually comprising 2 large interesting dormers that on the north side extend over a covered porch on first floor. Prominent semi-circular, almost Romanesque windows on n. & e. Exterior color scheme - red painted with green trim - probably original to house. Two-story gabled barn in style and period of house, clapboard with fish-scale shingled gable ends. House is set back (and partially hidden by trees) on southeast corner of intersection of Routes 101 and 137. It has maintained fields with woods to south and east of house.

19. History
This house, built in 1890, has been continuously occupied by descendants of its original owner, Dr. Horace C. Wood (1832-1893), lawyer, author, and at one time District Attorney of Vermont. His wife Almira was great-granddaughter of Moses Greenwood (1750-1829), who settled in Dublin in 1771, fought at Ticonderoga and served as Dublin's first librarian. Wood's daughter Marjorie married Harvey C. Hayes (1877-1967), Harvard PhD, professor of physics at Swarthmore College, director of the Sound Division of the US Naval Research Laboratory, and inventor of sonar.

20. Significance
This picturesque, virtually unaltered summer cottage represents a lively and individual interpretation of the resort styles of the period, and is one of the few Shingle-Style buildings on the east side of town. Home of Dr. Harvey C. Hayes, internationally known physicist and inventor of sonar.

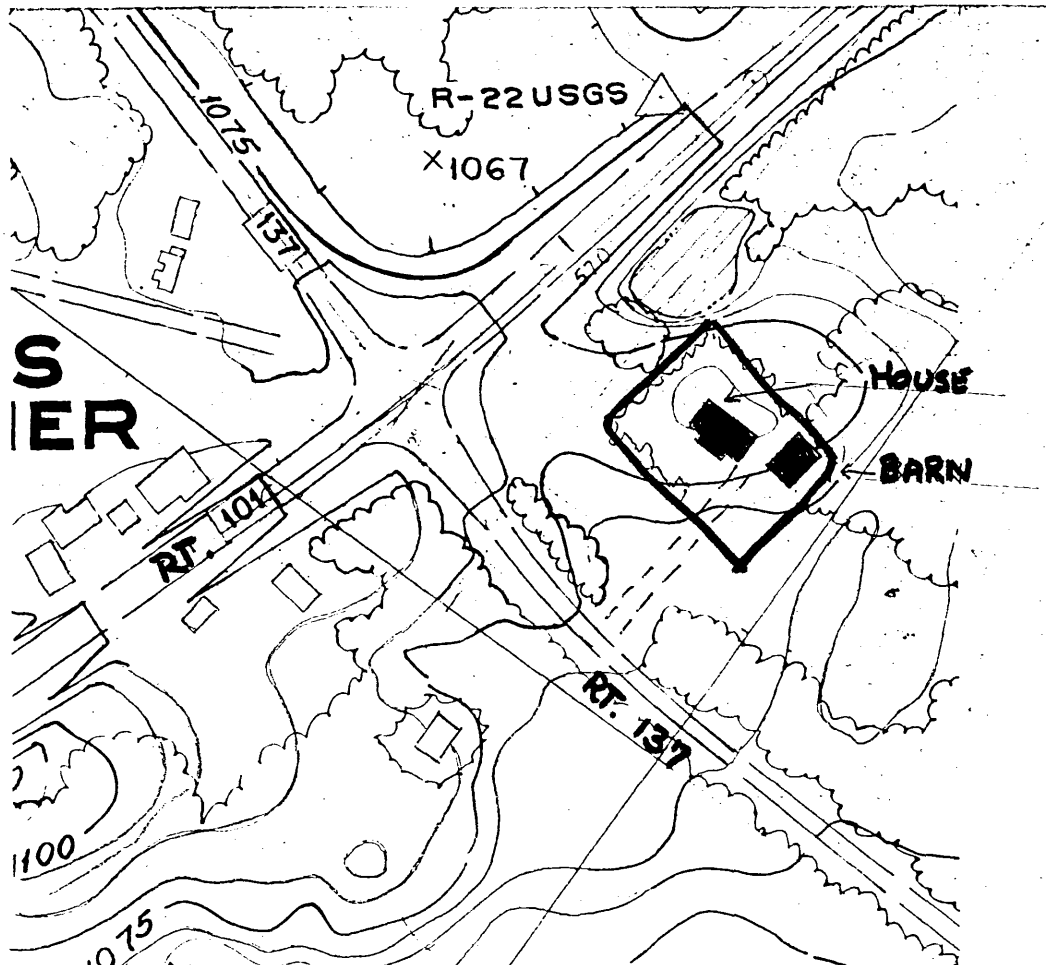

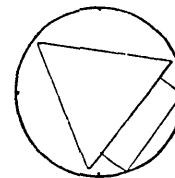
