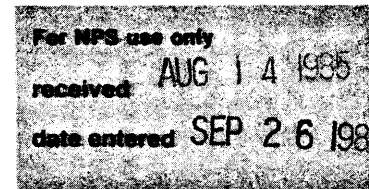

4. Owner: Leo Gallegos Jr., 931 Prince, Las Vegas, N.M.

7. Description: Rectangular-shape with shed-roofed rear; rubble sandstone foundation; clapboard with endboards; corrugated metal roof; small overhang with frieze boards; chamfered stick work in gables; 2/2 double-hung windows with wood surrounds; single door with transom; lath-turned porch columns, railing, and frieze; located in a residential area one block south of the proposed Lincoln Park District.

8. Significance: This is one of the few intact examples of a type of Wood Vernacular house built in the 1890's; the other good examples are in the proposed expanded Lincoln Park District. These houses are larger than the first workers' houses of the 1880's (ills. 12, 13, 26) but they retain the straight forward, front-facing gable massing. The gable stick work and porch lathe work are drawn from the local version of the Stick Style or Queen Anne. This limited picturesqueness is further enhanced by the off-center door.

10. Acreage: under 1. UTM Reference: 13 480400 3938110

Boundary: The southeast half of Lots 13-14 of Block 2 of the T. Romero Addition.
