DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Blacksmith Shop (Offutt Air Force Base), Building 44, is located on the south side of Grant Pass Road near the southwest corner of the 502.59 acres of land acquired by the Government in 1889 to establish Fort Crook, now known as Offutt Air Force Base. Grant Pass Road comprises a portion of the on-base road net. The base is located adjacent to U.S. Highway 73-75 about 10 miles south of downtown Omaha, Nebraska. The base is adjacent to the southwest edge of the central business district of Bellevue, Nebraska.

The original contours of the land area surrounding the Building have been changed very little by grading for parking lots and streets. The Building is located on the site where it was originally constructed.

Construction of the Blacksmith Shop (Building 44) was completed in 1893. The Building, a handsome single story structure, was designed as a regimental blacksmith, tinsmith, plumber, paint, carpenter, and wheelwright shop.

The Blacksmith Shop faces north and has a hipped roof. The slate shingles have been replaced with asphalt 3-tab shingles. The walls are red pressed brick set on an off-white limestone block foundation. The two large brick chimneys originally used to vent space heaters are intact. The 31 windows and 4 doors are arched. The doors originally were tall enough and wide enough to permit entry and exit of animals, but the doors have been closed or reduced to standard size personnel doors with wood framing.

The interior of the Building is divided into three sections by two 12-inch thick brick partitions, and the walls are exposed brick. The wood floor in the center section has been replaced with a concrete slab. The floors in all three sections have been overlayed with wall-to-wall carpet. Other interior modifications include the installation of fluorescent lights, overhead gas space heaters, central air conditioning, and two bathrooms with a commode and wash basin.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Blacksmith Shop is significant for its architecture, excellent craftsmanship, and its role in support of military operations. The Building is a tangible reminder of a method of warfare that is now extinct. It is one of two or three buildings in the geographic area and the only one of the two or three buildings still under Government control constructed initially to support horse drawn implements of war. The original architectural character and beauty of the Building has been preserved, except the slate roof.

Plans for the Building were made in 1888 and money for its construction was appropriated during the term of President Grover Cleveland. In 1894 the Building was occupied by the 22nd U.S. Infantry Regiment. The Building later served the 6th, 11th, 17th, and 30th U.S. Infantry Regiments, and the 7th Army Corps Headquarters.

From 1933 until 1938 the Building was used as a Civil Conservation Corps (CCC) Head-quarters. From 1938 until 1941 the Building was used for an electric and sheet metal shop when it was converted by the Army Quartermaster Corps to a railroad weigh station. In about 1946 the Building was converted to a Squadron Headquarters for the Air Installation Engineer Squadron, now known as the Civil Engineer Squadron. In 1957 the use was again changed and since that time it has been used as a Library and Cultural Center. However, a new library is scheduled for completion in 1977.




