In 1952, this group was no longer able to care for the historic structure and reported their intention to disband. It was then transferred to the jurisdiction of the Board of Historic Sites. Early in 1964, the Board commissioned Vermont artist Paul V. Winters to build a diorama depicting the second engagement action at the hard-fought Bennington Battle. This fine work in full color is historically accurate, the detail well authenticated by research. It gives the visitor a dramatic glimpse of our historic past.
