Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

7. Description

The parish church San Carlos Borromeo of Aguadilla sits in front of the town plaza, oriented on an east-west axis, its entrance facing west. The church occupies an entire town block with busy streets on three sides and a secondary street and parking area on its north side. It is separated from its immediate surroundings by a concrete and iron grillwork fence enclosing a paved cement area.

The plan follows the basilica prototype of two aisles and a nave covered with a flat roof. According to Arch. Thomas S. Marvel and Art Historian Maria Luisa Moreno, this church has the only example on the Island of an apse covered with a groin vault instead of a dome or barrel vault. The plan consists of five bays plus the apse/sacristies. Simple arcades resting on round columns divide the aisles from the main nave. The roof is made of wooden beams and paneling. The side aisles are lower than the central nave and are slightly pitched. The side aisles culminate in blind arches. These arches and the apse wall are covered with colored marble. The altar is modern. The floors have been recently restored with marble tiles and the church has been air-conditioned. The doors and windows are made of wood and colored plexiglass. Original brick and mortar constitute the main construction materials.

The facade is flanked by two towers which are decidedly different. In 1862 the first tower was built to hold a clock. The south tower was built in 1874. Later, in 1887, the facade was remodeled following plans drawn by State Architect Pedro Cobreros, which included three pointed arches, a straight cornice and two towers. However, as a result of damages from a 1918 earthquake, some changes were made to the facade. The destroyed south tower was rebuilt to a height lower than the original, and the straight cornice that ran between the two towers was substituted by curved sloping walls, resulting in the present facade. Both towers are octagonal. The north tower holds a clock, has four arched openings and is covered by a small dome. The south tower, shorter than the north tower, has eight openings and is covered by an octagonal pyramid.

The facade has three pointed arched doors. The main entrance, is framed by two pairs of pilasters crowned by a simple entablature. Above this, a round opening permits light to enter the interior space. A small triangular pediment crowns the facade. Two additional doors leading into the side aisles flank the main entrance.

There is one arched doorway and two windows on each side of the main interior space, and a small door leading to the sacristies on the north side. On the south, a modern meeting room was added, and to the rear of the church a two story modern structure was attached.


Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The parish church San Carlos Borromeo of Aguadilla is of historical and architectural significance. The original church was built in 1783. The two towers were added in 1862 and 1874 respectively. In 1887 remodeling plans were drawn for the church by State Architect Pedro Cobreros. This church has the only example on the Island of a groin vault covering the apse, adding architectural significance to the building.

Three noteworthy wooden carvings representing Jesús de Nazareno, Virgen Dolorosa and San José, dating from circa 1850 are kept in the sacristies. They are used in processions and religious festivities. The building retains most of its construction design elements of 1887. The traditional relationship of the main plaza, city hall and church is maintained, in accordance with Spanish Crown ordinances at the time the town was founded, providing us with a living example of the town planning practices characteristic of the Spanish colonial period in Puerto Rico.
