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The following buildings are the best remaining structures. <u>Courthouse</u>: This building was constructed in 1874 for \$34,000. It is a red brick structure of two stories, with a cupola on top. The bricks used in its construction, and the large stones making up the foundation, were both local products. It is in fairly good condition, but some deterioration has occurred. The high glass windows are gone, as well as all interior furnishings. The courthouse is an interesting example of nineteenth century architecture. Historically, it is one of the few remaining unoccupied courthouses of the period. A prime threat to this structure is the present commercial value of used red brick.

<u>Cosmopolitan Saloon:</u> This wooden structure, built around 1870 stands on Main Street, opposite the courthouse. Besides being a saloon, it was used as a music hall and many performers appeared there.

Monitor-Belmont Mill, and Combination Mill. The most outstanding feature of the two mills are their smokestacks. These are of brick and reach fifty to sixty feet into the air.

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
