#### SUMMARY

The Charles H. Murphy, Sr. House, built in 1925-26, is a two-and-a-half story Tudor Revival residence designed by Charles L. Thompson. Constructed of hollow tile with brick and stucco veneer, this house clearly demonstrates the popularity of English-inspired architectural designs during the 1920's and reveals Thompson's ability to the adapt the style to a convenient American residence.

#### ELABORATION

Situated on a six acre lot landscaped by Meuller of Memphis, the Murphy House was designed in the Tudor Revival Style by Charles L. Thompson. A dominant feature of the landscape is a circular drive to the south of the house that passes through a porte-cochere and surrounds a small formally landscaped area. Bounding the front of the property is a wrought iron fence broken by brick columns with double iron gates. The plan of the Murphy House is asymmetrical, as are each of the elevations. The irregular roofline is achieved by a large roof, gabled at one end and hipped at the other, with nine gabled projections and a rear wing with hipped roof, all of which are covered with tile. Of hollow tile construction, the house has a predominantly red brick veneer laid in common bond, with several gable ends and portions of the second floor covered with halftimbered stucco. The window sills, main entrance trim and chimney caps are of dressed Bedford limestone. The front (east) elevation has a long roof slope punctured by a wide central chimney, a common Tudor Revival feature, that intersects a dormer. A one-story gabled wing with exterior end chimney extends from the north end, balanced on the south by the gabled porte-cochere. A one-story off-center gabled entrance with arched opening projects from the wall, and intersects with a two-story projection to the right. The front door is paneled wood with glass lights above. A one-story gabled projection with an inset arch of stone above the windows extends from the south corner. The overhanging eaves are supported by large wood brackets. Both casement and double-hung windows are found throughout the house. As mentioned, each side elevation has a one-story gabled projection. The east side elevation consists of two full height gable ends, from which extends the porte-cochere. Two gabled wings, one with a hipped roof extension, project from the rear. Between the bedroom and kitchen wings is a slate terrace with an iron railing. Also on the rear is a sleeping porch with triple hung windows.

The Tudor Style is represented in many interior details, notably the staircase, fireplace mantels and bookshelves. The staircase alcove, living room fireplace and library bookcases have the characteristic Tudor arches. Interior walls are plaster, the floors oak and the trim is beautifully finished red gum. The rooms across the front-living room, living porch, entrance hall, library and dining room are all connected by French doors with six-light transoms. The dominant feature of the

interior is the beautiful alcoved staircase. Three steps lead to a landing, from which the stairs continue at a right angle. Paneled wood pilasters on either side of the stairwell support an architrave and cornice. Further detailing the stairs is a carved railing and newel post. All rooms are detailed with picture mouldings and the living room, hall, library and dining room have cornices. Architrave mouldings surround all doors and windows. The library has an exposed beam ceiling and built-in bookcases. Both the kitchen and breakfast room have a built-in china cabinet. There are four original wood burning fireplaces. A fifth fireplace was added to the screened living porch when it was enclosed in 1953. The first and second floors each have three bedrooms. Part of the large recreation attic was designed as a nursery.

As mentioned the screened porch on the front of the house was enclosed in 1953. Also in that year, the grass terrace between the kitchen and bedroom wings was paved with slate. In 1963 the kitchen was remodeled. Other changes include the replacement of some rough plaster with that of a smoother texture.

A three car garage, separate from the house, is constructed of the red brick. Originally the grounds included a chicken yard and a barn. Located to the rear of the house are a pool and tennis court.

#### Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

Designed by Charles L. Thompson, the Charles H. Murphy, Sr., House illustrates how expertly Thompson could blend the needs and tastes of his clients with popular trends in American architecture. The house which was constructed in 1925 shows the strong influence of the Tudor Revival which was part of a larger movement in the 1920's to replicate and adapt many of the designs found in the English countryside. Charles L. Thompson was a noted Arkansas architect who was in great demand throughout his long career. The firm he founded in 1886 is still in existence under the leadership of his son-in-law. The landscape firm Mueller of Memphis was hired to plan a setting which would be in keeping with the house. The stone wall surrounding the drive, the walks to the pool and tennis courts, and the various groupings of plantings are all a part of their original design. This distinctive house was constructed for Charles Haygood Murphy, Sr., who settled in El Dorado following the death of his uncle, Fletcher Sample. As executor of the estate, Murphy was charged with conducting the business affairs of J. F. Sample Company which was a local retail store. In 1915, Murphy married Bertie Wilson who worked at Citizens Bank of which he was chief executive. She had been raised in El Dorado and following her graduation from Galloway College in Searcy had worked as a court reporter as well as on the staff of Governor George W. Donaghey. Besides involvement in the banking industry, Murphy was also quite active in the timber business which led to his extensive investment in land. Following the oil boom in Union County in the early 1920's, these land holdings were extremely valuable. They helped form the basis for the highly successful Murphy Oil Corporation of which Charles H. Murphy, Sr., was founder. Murphy Oil was one of the early oil companies formed following the boom and has evolved into an international corporation with numerous subsidiaries under its umbrella. From its corporate headquarters in El Dorado, Murphy Oil conducts oil and gas exploration operations in the U. S., Canada, the Persian Gulf, Venezuala, the North Sea, and other areas abroad. Charles H. Murphy, Sr., achieved tremendous success in the business community and the home he and his wife comissioned represents that success as well as the enduring qualities of Charles L. Thompson's work.


